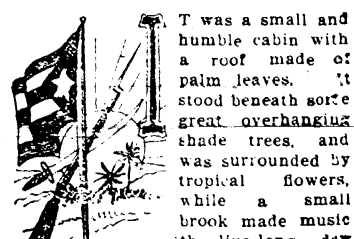

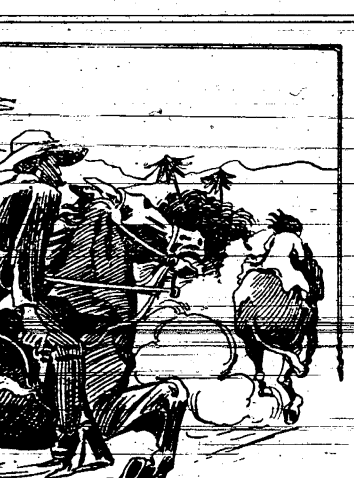
### OF INTEREST TO WOMEN.
