SPECIAL SESSION DOINGS. NEWSY GENERALITIES The legislature convened again or the 27th. The joint resolution was discussed in the senate and it is believed will be thrown down. However, that body has a third substitute measure. The substitute was simply reported to the senate with the recommendation that it be referred to the committee of the whole.

The senate committee to whom the ouse resolution was submitted, on the 27th reported the following resolution as a third substitute to the tax amendment:

"Sec. 10. The state may continue to collect all specific taxes accruing to the treasury under existing laws. The legislature may provide for the collechol plant. lutely confident of the success of the Boers. You may take my word for it that thousands of Russians are now fighting under Gen. Joubert."

The British troops at Mafeking .attacked the Boer fort at Molopo on the Seth. and were so persistent in captur-ing the fort that there was fighting right on the very walls of it, but the Roers managed to retain their position. The British loss is reported at 55 dead.

A report from Col. Pilcher of the British forces says that on Jan. 1 he completely defeated the Boers in com mand at Sunnyside laagar, taking the laager and capturing 40 prisoners, with a loss of only two privates killed and one lieutenant wounded.

News has been received of a complete victory for the British at Colesburg. Gen. French was in command of the British forces, and when he once got the Boers on the move he kept them going and captured the town with lit-tle difficulty.

The guns which were captured from Gen. Buller at Colenso have been mounted in the hills commaning the drift over the Tugela river at Spring-field. The Boers also captured 620 rounds of shrapnel when they tool guns.

The lord mayor of London, Alfred Newton, is raising and equipping a force of 1,000 volunteers among the city corps. The large city firms are contri-buting the necessary expenses.

Ugly rumors are in circulation of a Dutch rising with the object of seizing Cape Town and the docks and capturing the governor of Cape Colony, Sir Alfred Milner.

The Boers possess immense food which was imported by speculative capitalists under a belief that mining would be allowed during the war. An entire regiment of soldiers is said to be enroute from the Dutch colony in Nioux county, Ia., to- join, the Boers in the Transvaal.

The Irish societies in New York city are very bitter in their denunciation of the British government in South Africa. Toledo Irishmen are ready and willng to join the Boer forces in defending their undisputed rights.

It is reported that 1.200 more Canadians will join the British in the Trans vaal war.
