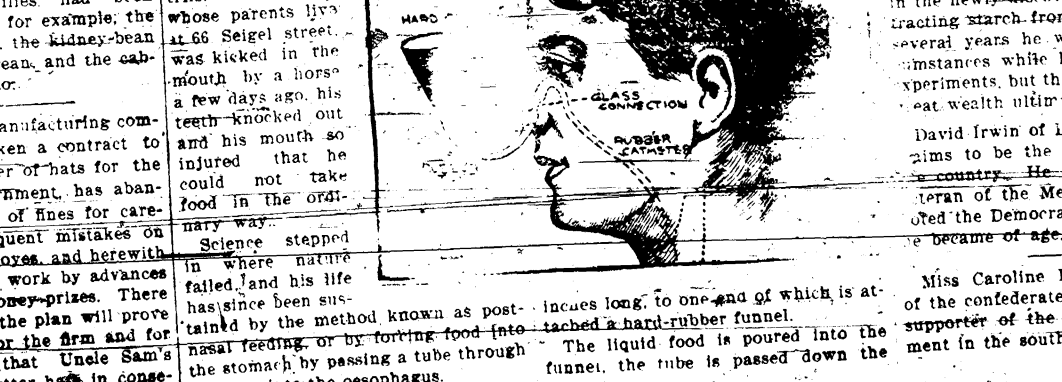
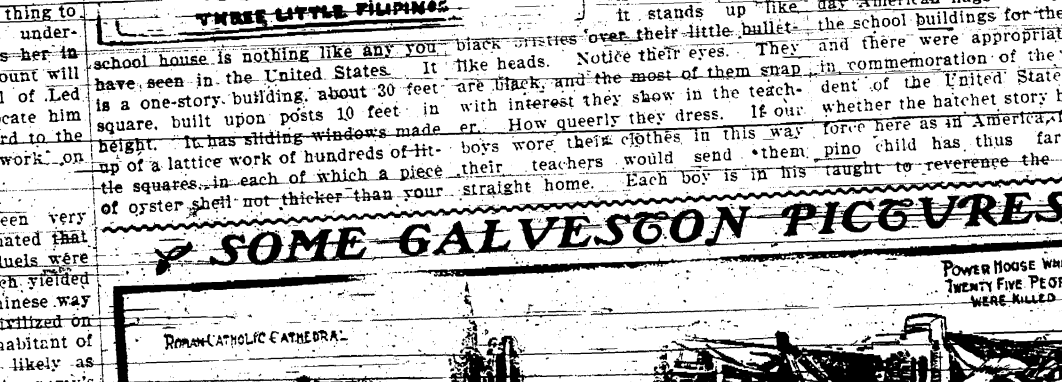
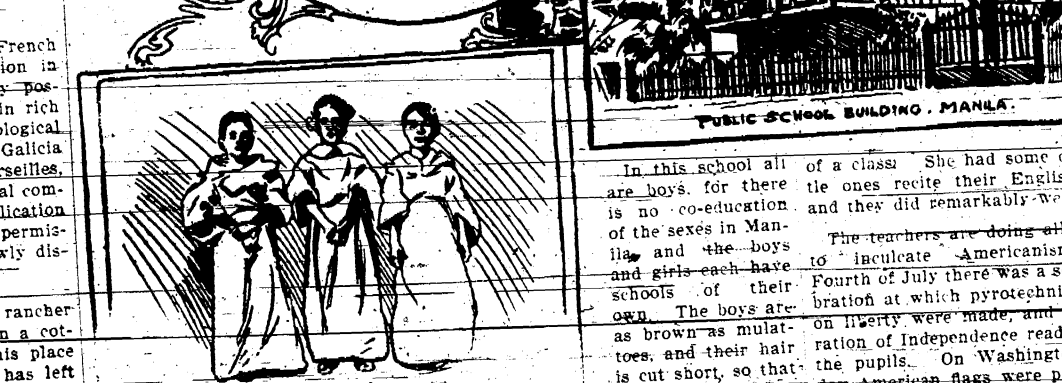

ABLE BOER LEADER.

GEN. OLIVIER, RECENTLY CAPTURED BY THE BRITISH.

It Was He Who Led Gatacre Into the Trap at Stormberg—Tribute Paid to Him by One of the Representative Men of the South African Republic.

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WHAT A MOGUL CAN DO.

That was a remarkable demonstration of what a Mogul can do, that occurred on the New York Central the other day, when engine No. 948, one of the new Moguls, hauled out train No. 41, the Southwestern Limited, made up of two mail cars, five passenger coaches and nine Wagner cars, sixteen cars in all. The total weight of the train was 1,822,000 pounds, or 916 tons, and the length of the train, including the engine, was 1,212 feet, or nearly a quarter of a mile.

Broom Corn up to \$100 a Ton. The price of broomcorn jumped from \$80 to \$100 a ton at Arcola, Ill., Tuesday, and brush sold freely at the latter figure.
