Joseph Ladue, the founder of Dawson City in the Klondike, died last week at his home in Schuyler Falls, N. Y. He had not been well since his return from Alaska and spent last winter at Colorado Springs in a vain search for health. He fell a victim to pneumonia contracted in the severe northern climate. He leaves a widow and one son.

The adventurous career of the prospector was begun on a farm near the northern end of Lake Champlain, where he was born. In 1845 he moved to the Yukon, and finally located on the Upper valley of the gold-bearing stream. He was successful in finding gold, and now has a well established and a well equipped trading post.

It was upon his land that gold was first discovered in the Yukon region, and Ladue's trading post became the prosperous city of Dawson, the northern city of gold. His estate in the Klondike region, which he had inherited, has been sold for several millions of dollars.
