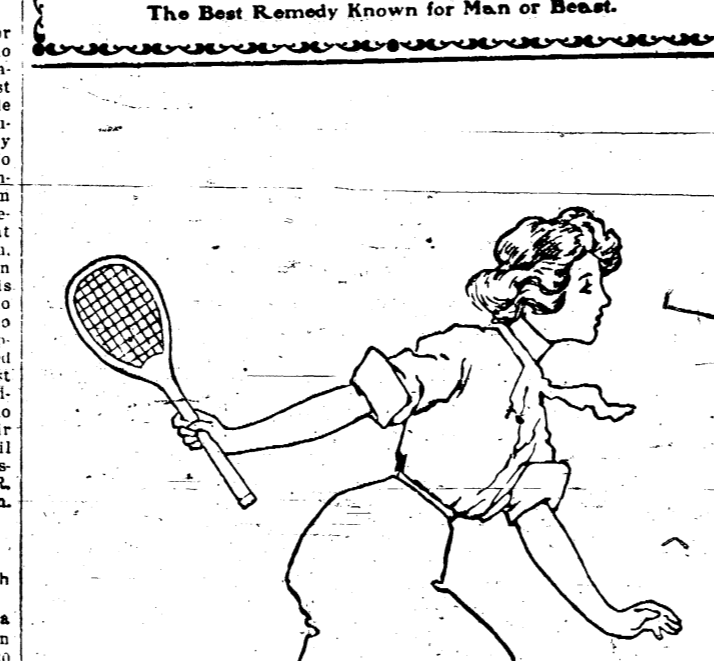

This year's tax levy will be \$2,669,943.53, an item of \$175,000 having been included in the appropriation table published. The reduction in the levy is due to the fact that it will not be necessary to raise any money for the Spanish war loan sinking fund. The law provides that the money with which to pay off the war bonds shall be raised by a levy of one-eighth of a mill on each dollar of assessed valuation each year until the bonds are paid.
