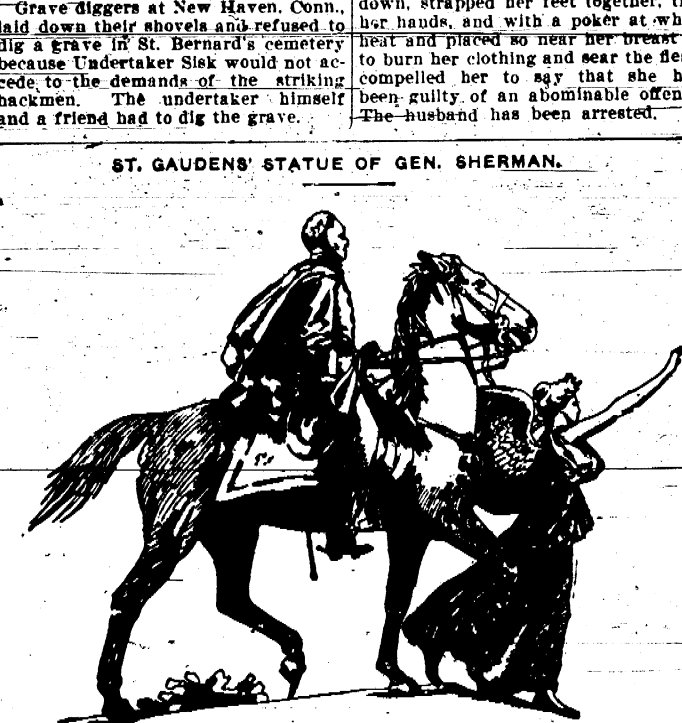

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Big Contract Was Awarded.
The executive board of the Toledo Portland Cement company, at a meeting held last evening in room 524 The Nobby awarded the contract for new buildings to the Forest City Steel & Iron company, of Cleveland. The buildings will be located at Manchester, Mich., and are to be completed within three and one-half calendar months from the date of contract. As heretofore mentioned in The Blade, the plan of this concern is to be located at Manchester, Mich., and is to be a million dollar, nearly all the stock held by Toledo. The executive board consists of Dr. William Watts, president; Albert W. Butler, secretary-treasurer; and C. M. Cooley, general manager. Prof. R. C. Carpenter, who holds one of the contracts awarded to this concern, is a consulting engineer and a stockholder. The work of erecting the factory site and the mill will begin next Monday, and it is expected that rapid progress will be made with the construction of the mill buildings. The members of the board of directors, all of whom reside in Toledo, will go to Manchester Thursday morning to inspect the site and to make plans for the foundation. It is expected that the directors will be accompanied by a number of prominent business men, including M. F. Whitely, H. W. Robinson, Fred Whitaker, H. C. Gory, and Owen Conant. Whitely at Manchester the directors will place the contract for all machinery with which the plant is to be supplied.—The Toledo Blade.

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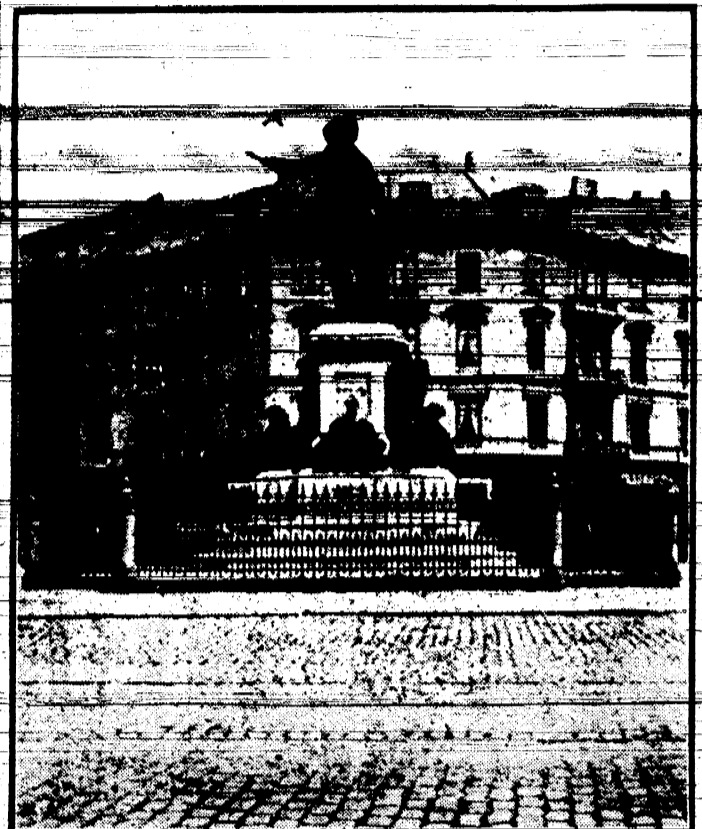

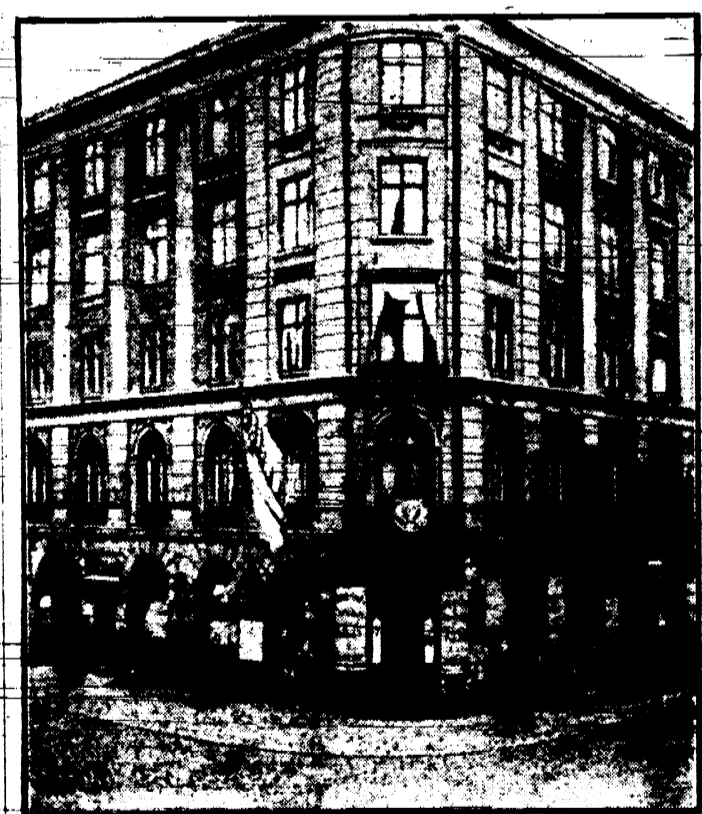
