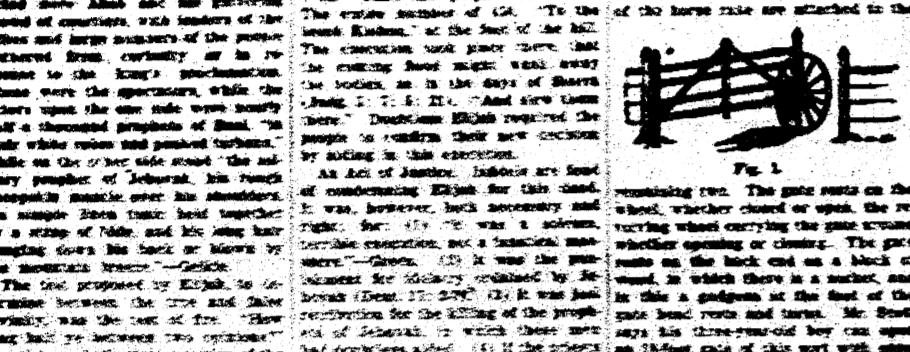

Sabbath School

LESSON IX, AUGUST 12.

Genesis 22:—In My Father's Land, and He Heard Me.

I. The Angry Queen.—Vs. 1, 2. While Abrahah was near Eliah, the work being controlled by the masterful prophet. No sooner had he saved his palace at Jericho than all his new acquaintances were swept away by his masterful words, who are like the sea chameleon, and take their color from the thing they rest upon.

"Abrahah had received all that Eliah had done." The wicked queen had received in the downward of the rate. Probably she imagined that Eliah had been overthrown by numbers and his influence broken by her plots. And now to learn that this very storm was washing their corpses out to sea!

2. "Then Jesebel, scornfully ignoring her husband, sent a messenger unto Eliah, who had remained at the gate, spending the night in the open air. He would be ready for whatever work God had for him in the morning, but he refused to enter the city, either through fear of the king, or as a Miligan thinks, through humility, 'in the same spirit as that which led him to roll before Ahab's chariot.' So let the gods (plural, as an idolater would speak) 'do to me and mine.' 'A standing formal in Israel at all times.'—Commentary. 'If I make not thy life as the life of one of them.' The end prophesies of Ahab. 'By to-morrow about this time.' She gave him only one day to live. Doubtless she thought his wife in her power, and could not refrain from this impetuous burst of wrath against him. Perhaps she was too angry to reflect that thus she gave Eliah an opportunity of flight.

3. The Discayer Prophet.—Vs. 3, 4. "And when he saw that," Saw, namely, Jesebel's determined malignity, and that he risked his life by remaining. He knew all the byways, and hunted out of the kingdom of Israel to "Beer-sheba," on the farthest out- venge of the kingdom of Judah, a run of thirty-five miles, that must have been made by foot, with a wife and a household substance. "And left his servants there." He was left at Beer-sheba, "because he knew that Ahab would be alone with God; possibly because the boy was then too exhausted to go further."—Pulpit Commentary.

Was This Flight Justifiable? Many consider that Eliah, who was certainly a man of God (17: R. V.), "a man of the passions with us," fled without waiting for God's commands, which hitherto had directed his movements. On the contrary, says Farrar, "it was not part of his duty to throw away his life, and give a constant example to the Baal worshippers whom he had so bravely humiliated." Eliah's flight was not like Job's, to escape a dangerous task. His work was completed for the present, and he sought God for further orders.

4. "He himself went a day's journey into the wilderness." Eliah did not feel himself safe till he was beyond the territory of Judah, for Je-horamah was closely allied to Ahab (1 Kings 11: 4), and his son Jehoram married the daughter of Jesebel (2 Chron. 21: 6; 2 Kings 8: 18). "And set down under a juniper tree." Baal or the broom-plum (R. V. marg.). "He requested for himself that the wind blow." Like Moses in the same wilderness (Num. 11: 15), when the people murmured, "I am not better than my father." "These words clearly reveal the great hopes Eliah had formed as to the result of his mission, and the terrible disappointment his banishment had occasioned him."—Pulpit Com. He had hoped to accomplish the regeneration of his people, and restore the pure worship of Jehovah. His fathers had died without accomplishing this, and now he, probably by this time an old man, seemed to have lived an equally fruitless life.

III. The Ministerial Angel.—Vs. 5-8. Eliah had reached the darkest hour of his life; but "it is always darkest just before day."

5. "As he lay and slept." The sleep of physical and mental exhaustion. The posts are right in praying sleep, which is one of God's best gifts to man. The sweeter description is in Ps. 127: 2. "He giveth his beloved sleep" (or "in their sleep"). "An angel touched him." One of God's ministerial spirits, "Arise and eat." "Probably he had eaten little or nothing since leaving Jericho." "Sence the angel might have strengthened Eliah by a word or by the touch, but had used appropriate means, and works wherever possible along the lines of natural law.

6. "There was a cake" (that had been) "baked on the coal" (or "not warmed." R. V. marg.). This was the eastern bread, in a flat, fat cake, baked, as was customary, in the bottom of the sand lined with stones. "Had a crum" (or better "of water." Bread and water supply the simple means of the desert Arab. We are reminded of the first of coals, who fish, and bread (John 21: 9) which the risen Christ had waiting for his weary disciples. "And laid him down." Not because he did not appreciate the gift, but because his exhausted body must have more sleep. "I came again the second time." "Probably he had eaten but little the first time, for sorrow and weariness."—Pulpit Com. "Because the journey

MAR'S CAUSE OF INFLUENZA.

Another Danger That Threatens Soldiers in Modern War.

Dr. Paul Jacoby, physician in chief to the provincial asylum of Orel, Russia, urges the necessity of a special array medical service for insanity, to which privation, fatigue, the nervous tension caused by ever present danger, the frequent mental shocks, alcoholism and wounds predispose the soldier, and especially in remote campaigns where there are no social amenities like that in which Russia is now engaged. Dr. Jacoby served in the Franco-Prussian war and was then impressed with the great number of cases of mental disorder which came under his attention, and his further researches have shown that the malady is common in all wars. He compares the sinking of warships by mines and torpedoes to earthquakes and volcanic eruptions, which are well known to produce mental disorders, and thinks that these new forms of shock will tend to produce new forms of mental disorder.
