During Angust, accord-ing to a report issued by Railroad Commissioner Atwood the earnings of Michigan railroads were \$5,216,923.98. This is \$306,904 more than was earned during the month of August one year ago and is probably the largest amount of earnings ever reported for a single month. Up to September 1 the railmonth. roads of Michigan had this year earned. \$35,887,600, which is over \$3,100,000 more than was earned in the same period last year.
