# POINTERS ON EGG COOKERY.

Chances and eggs, both having great nutritive value, may be made into a place of meat during a brief season, says the Home Magazine. Epicures give an egg to have the best results should be 12 hours old, and certainly eggs over a week old are not palatable when boiled, though not so when fried. The best eggs to use are those which are fresh and are of a serviceable in other dishes. In cooking eggs it should be remembered that the yolk is the most important and chiefly composed, is most easily digested when slightly coagulated, while the white is the least digestible and is most easily digested when it is turned into a foam. To boil eggs evenly, put them into a dish having a tight cover and pour boiling water over them in such a proportion of two quarts to one dozen eggs, cover and set at the back of the stove. After seven minutes turn the eggs, recover and in six minutes more the eggs will be cooked. When more eggs than four are used by this method, about ten minutes longer after the turning will be required. In this way the white of the egg-cook is a better consistency, while the yolk is much harder.

# OLD MAIDS SCARCE

Unmarried women are scarce in the Virginia mountains. In a summer's sojourn in a mountain country of old Virginia a tourist made the acquaintance of fully 700 young men, and found but one "old maid," and she was "old" only in the sense that the mountain vernacular means "to pay court or to accept it."

Girls begin to "talk" at 15—even 12, in localities far removed from the cities. The little maid leaves off her red calico "aloeve apron," the "head bands" that she had back her hair, puts her hair in a big knob on the back of her head and lets her hair down, but, contrary to the almost universal practice of the Africans, she does not wear a headscarf. On the contrary, the implement oftenest seen in their hands is a hoe. Nevertheless, they appear to have been probably driven southward from their original mountain home by some "settling" contemporary, while the work of this past may be seen in their semi-military architecture, which does not differ from that of the mountain people. At a little distance one of the villages looks like a fortified camp.

# ORDER OF ACQUITTAL REFUSED BY COURT

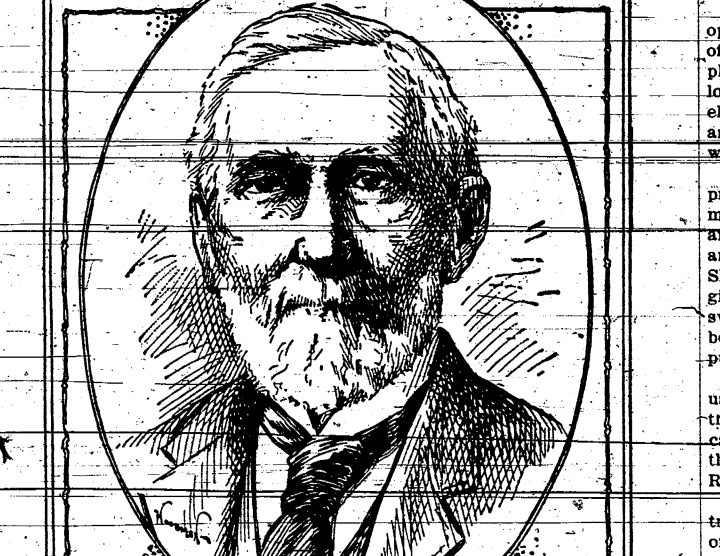
Haywood Defense Refused by Judge Wood to Present Evidence.
