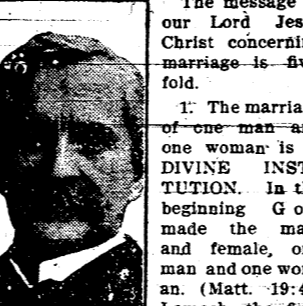


MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE

"HERE"

BY RUTH RAYMOND THE STOOD among the ranks that day. Our soldier brave and tall...



The message of our Lord Jesus Christ concerning marriage is five-fold.

1. The marriage of one man and one woman is a DIVINE INSTITUTION. In the beginning God made the male and female, one man and one woman. (Matt. 19:4.)

Lamech, the first polygamist, was a civilization of city-building, music and mechanical arts without any recognition of God, whose authority he had repudiated, and polygamy, which, like other sins, God endured but never approved, was in direct opposition to his law.

2. The marriage of one man and one woman is not only a divine institution, but a DIVINE ACT, "WHAT GOD HATH JOINED TOGETHER," (Matt. 19:6.) The fact that marriages turn out badly is not proof that God did not have part in the ceremony. The first marriage did not turn out very well. The husband was enticed by the wife into sin, and both husband and wife learned to know what a broken heart means when they stood over the corpse of their son, slain by the murderous hand of his brother.

3. The marriage of one man and one woman by this divine institution and divine act JOINS HUSBAND AND WIFE IN A RELATION CLOSER AND MORE BINDING THAN THE RELATION BETWEEN PARENT AND CHILD. We read in Genesis 2:24: "Therefore shall a man leave his father and mother and cleave unto his wife. Jesus quotes these words with approval. (Matt. 19:5.)

4. The marriage of one man and one woman by divine institution and divine act, joining them in a relation closer and more binding than the relation between parent and child, SO UNITES HUSBAND AND WIFE THAT THEY CEASE TO BE TWO, AND BECOME ONE FLESH. Jesus declares that they are no more two, but one flesh. (Matt. 19:5.) I do not know all that this means, but it plainly teaches the quality of husband and wife, and makes this quality the unit of home life, treating husband and wife never as individuals, but as one. The quality of husband and wife makes a living organism, of which Paul says the husband is the head and the wife is the body. To summarize: it is to destroy this living organism; and that is murder. The word "sunder" is very suggestive. Some early Christians were "sawn sunder," and that is the kind of work the divorce courts are doing. They are sawing sunder those who in God's sight are organically one and are thus murdering the home life of our land.

His Lost Pistols. One of Col. Hinman Rhodes' Revolver Returned.

E. M. Rhodes, Apalachin, N. Y. sends the following clipping of his pistols, ivory-handled, with silver mountings, which belonged to his father, Hinman Rhodes, colonel of the Twenty-eighth Illinois, relates the National Tribune. The pistols were present and highly valued. They were inscribed: "Hinman Rhodes, Major, Twenty-eighth Illinois Infantry." They were lost in a fierce fight with Forrest's men, and nothing more heard of them until Lieut. William Noonan formerly of the same regiment, wrote that he had gotten track of the weapons. Before he could recover them he was laid to rest in the National cemetery at Natchez, Miss. Col. Rhodes then took up the search for his pistols himself, and after considerable correspondence with members of Forrest's cavalry, at last located one of his pistols in the hands of Maj. H. B. Vaughn of Kingston, Miss. Maj. Vaughn's letters were admirable in their loyalty and soldierly spirit. Finally Capt. Foster, Natchez, Miss., forwarded one of the pistols to Col. Hinman Rhodes by express, with a touching letter, in which he said: "Looking back for nearly a half century, the war seems like a horrid dream, but it was terrible, with the god of battles with the union army in the greatest of civil wars and all is well. Out of that war I am born to us, and our children a nation which is slow to anger, boasts not of vainglorious, but in the defense of right is unconquered and unconquerable." The pistol finally reached Pasadena, Cal., and was opened with trembling hands by one who had traveled by the side of Col. Hinman Rhodes for 40 years. He had died five days before the pistol arrived, and it was his widow to whom it came. Any information regarding the remaining pistol will be gladly received by Mrs. I. M. Rhodes, Pasadena, Cal.

Steuben, the German nobleman who, like the young Frenchman Lafayette, came to America and cast his lot with the colonists who were fighting for independence. He himself put his lofty motives on record by writing to the continental congress and proffering his services, saying he desired to "serve a nation engaged in the noble work of defending its rights and liberties," and that he had given up "an honorable title and lucrative rank, though he asked in return 'neither riches nor honors.'" In brief, he wished to serve as a volunteer, leaving it to congress to remunerate him if his work should be found satisfactory. This was during the darkest hour of the revolutionary struggle, and Steuben, after a long and perilous voyage, came to America and had his first interview with Washington at Valley Forge. Thereafter he became an important part of the continental army, his valuable services as an organizer and disciplinarian doing a great deal to effect the final triumph of the cause to which he devoted himself. A model for the statue in Lafayette park, Washington, directly in front of the White House, has been completed, says the Troy (N. Y.) Times, and the artistic character of the work is greatly admired. New York, which was the scene of much of Steuben's labors and which perpetuates his name in one of the counties of the state, has deep interest in the proposition to erect the statue, and there will be general gratification that the memorial is to be so worthy of the hero.

Chief of Cavalry. A strong recommendation for the appointment of an officer to be known as the 'chief of cavalry' has been made by a commission of cavalry officers attached to the Army Staff college. It is argued that the chief should be a member of the general staff and head of the committee considering questions relating to the cavalry, having power to inspect that branch of the service to determine where the standards of efficiency recommended may be maintained. The committee says that nearly every civilized nation has a cavalry official with powers and duties similar to those outlined above, and expresses the belief that the practice of those nations is ample warrant for the establishment of a similar officer in the American army.

FOR THE USERS OF TOBACCO. Assertion That Plant Was Certainly Placed Here for Good Purpose.

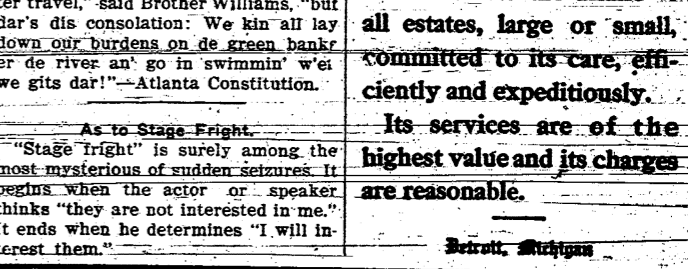
It is passing strange that, with all the experience at command, the physiologists are never in agreement as to the effects of the smoking habit. Even where lay opinion has been fairly well established by the apparently well digested views of the scientists with respect to certain phases of the whole problem, they are wholly liable to upsetting by the latest opinion. For example, two considerations have long been thought to be determined: that moderate indulgence in tobacco need not be denied, and that the bad not out of his "leaves" would better injure tobacco altogether. It may be asserted that man is not a smoker by nature, and certain effects of tobacco seem to indicate, without special argument, that the longest, the most tenacious of the habit is postponed the better for the human system. At the same time the remote antiquity of the tobacco plant suggests that it is one of nature's unassisted growths; and, if it were not designed for man to enjoy in security, neither is it at all clear that it is to be classed with nature's productions.—Providence Journal.

A Noiseless Room. For many a physical researcher a perfectly noiseless room is a desideratum. If such could be devised it would open out new possibilities of research. At the University of Utrecht the problem has been apparently successfully solved by the room designed by Zwaardemaker. The walls and ceiling of the room are 11 inches thick, and are formed of six separate layers. The first consists of a feltlike material of horsehair, known as trichopile, this is followed by a layer of porous stone isolated from the floor by sheet lead. An air space of about an inch is followed by wood, and then a course of ground cork and sand. The final layer is of specially prepared ground cork known as korkstels.
