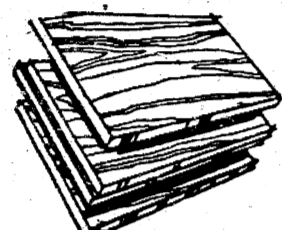

| 1 cup shortening (half butter)    | 8 egg whites, stiffly beaten         |
| 2 cups sugar                      | 4 cups California golden raisins     |
| 2 teaspoons vanilla               | 1 cup candied cherries               |
| 1 teaspoon almond extract         | 1 cup diced candied pineapple        |
| 1/2 teaspoon lemon extract        | 1 1/2 cups diced candied orange peel |
| 4 cups sifted flour               | 1 1/2 cups diced citron              |
| 2 teaspoons baking powder         | 1 1/2 cups flaked coconut            |
| 1 1/2 teaspoons salt              | 1 cup slivered blanched almonds      |
| 1/2 cup water                     |                                      |
| 1/2 cup sherry or pineapple juice |                                      |

Cream shortening, sugar and flavorings together until very light and fluffy. Resist flour with baking powder and salt. Add to creamed mixture alternately with water and sherry. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Fold in remaining ingredients until well blended. Spoon batter into 2 well-greased and floured 1 1/2 to 2-quart molds, filling to within 1/2 inch of top edge. Bake in slow oven (300 degrees F.) for 1 1/2 to 3 hours depending on size of cake. Pick inserted in center of cake will come out clean when cake is baked. Remove baked cakes from oven. Let stand in pans about 20 minutes before turning out on wire racks to cool. When thoroughly cold, wrap in foil and store in cool place to mellow before cutting, at least 3 to 4 days. Makes about 3 1/2 quarts batter.

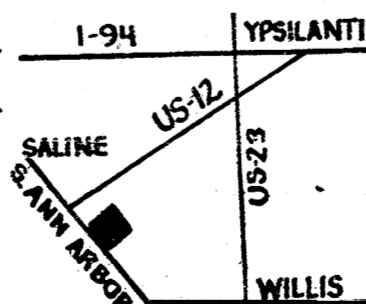

### CRACKLE-TOP PEANUT BUTTER COOKIES

- 1 cup margarine
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 3/4 cup peanut butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 3/4 cups flour
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Cream margarine and sugars. Blend in egg, peanut butter and vanilla. Add flour sifted with soda and salt; mix well. Shape teaspoonfuls of dough into balls; roll in sugar. Place on ungreased baking sheets; bake at 375° F., 10 to 12 minutes. Makes 4 dozen.

### CHOCOLATE SNOWBALLS

- 1 cup unsifted flour
- Pinch of salt
- 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa
- 1/4 pound (1 stick) butter
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup finely chopped walnuts

Confectioners' sugar  
On wax paper thoroughly stir together the flour, salt and cocoa. In a small mixing bowl cream butter, granulated sugar and vanilla; with a wooden spoon, gradually work in flour mixture, then walnuts. (Mixture will be stiff.) Shape into small marble-size balls -- one teaspoon dough for each. Place about one inch apart on a lightly greased cookie sheet. Bake in a preheated 350° F. oven for 15 minutes. Cookies may have slight cracks. Let stand until cool, or cookies will shatter; remove the wire rack to cool completely. Spread confectioners' sugar on wax paper; roll cookies in sugar. Store in a tightly covered tin box lined with wax paper or plastic wrap. Makes 4 dozen.

### RUM BALLS

- Combine and mix thoroughly:
- 2 cups vanilla wafer crumbs
- 3 tablespoons rum
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 4 tablespoons dark corn syrup

Shape into small balls the size of marbles. Roll in confectioners' sugar. Store in tightly closed container. Makes 4 dozen.

### RED VELVET CAKE

- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 tablespoons cocoa
- 2 ounces red food coloring
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 2 1/2 cups cake flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons soda
- 1 tablespoon vinegar

Cream sugar and shortening well, add eggs, make a paste of cocoa and food coloring (2 ounces in correct). Add to creamed mixture. Mix salt and vanilla and buttermilk, add alternately with flour. Mix soda and vinegar and fold into mixture. DO NOT BEAT. Bake in two 9-inch pans 30 minutes at 350° F.

### FROSTING

- 5 tablespoons flour
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Cook flour and milk until thick, stir constantly. Let cool. Cream together sugar and butter, add vanilla. Add flour mixture. Beat until looks like whipped cream, when you first begin to beat it, it will be curdly looking.

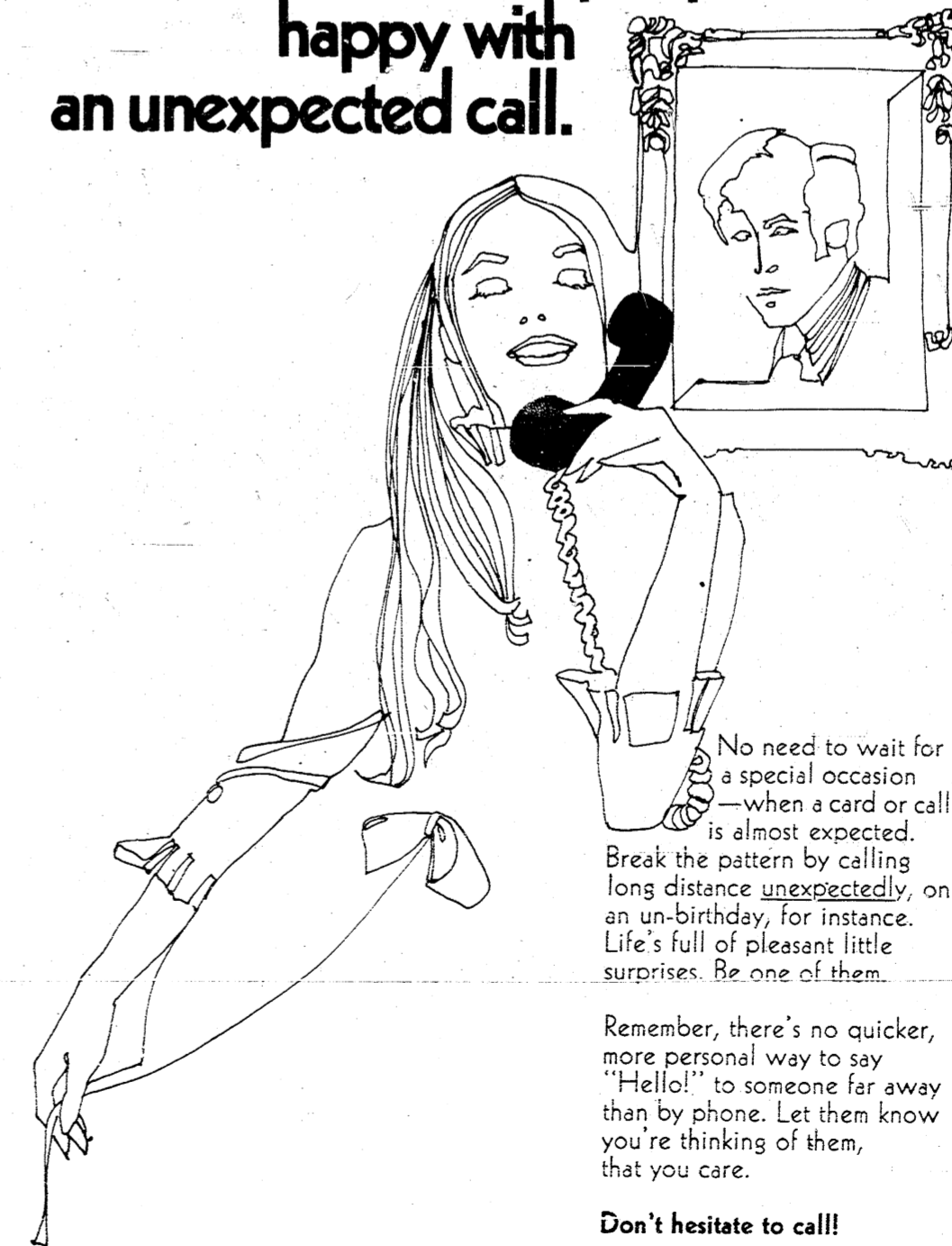

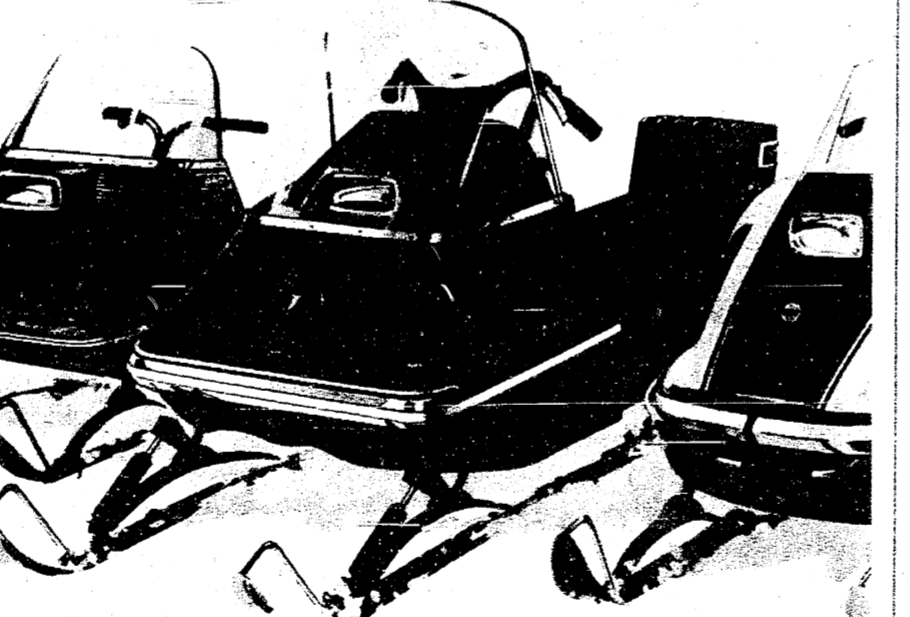
**Question:**

Special Turkey Stuffing



A plump, beautifully browned turkey is the highlight of many festive dinners, but often it is the stuffing that distinguishes the holiday bird. Today's Sausage-Apple Stuffing is an old-fashioned corn bread dressing delightfully seasoned with onion and sage. When planning your traditional holiday dinner, be sure to include this exceptionally good stuffing for the turkey.

**SAUSAGE-APPLE STUFFING**  
For one 10 to 12-lb. turkey plus a 1-1/2 qt. casserole

One pan corn bread, crumbled*	1 lb. bulk pork sausage meat
8 slices regular sliced white bread, lightly toasted and cubed	2 cups chopped onion
2 teaspoons salt	1/2 cup butter or margarine
1/2 teaspoon pepper	2 cups chopped apple
1 teaspoon sage	1 cup chicken or turkey stock
	2 eggs, beaten
	One 10 to 12-lb. turkey

Combine crumbled corn bread, bread cubes, salt, pepper and sage. Fry sausage until red color disappears crumbling with fork. Drain on absorbent paper. Add to bread mixture. Lightly saute onion in butter. Add to bread mixture with apples. Stir in stock and eggs. (Add more stock for more moist dressing.) Toss to blend well. Stuff into neck and body cavities of turkey. Truss. Roast according to standard roasting directions. Cook extra dressing in ungreased covered 1-1/2 qt. casserole in preheated slow oven (325°F.) about 1 hour.

**\*CORN BREAD**  
Makes one 9-inch corn bread

1-1/2 cups enriched corn meal	2 tablespoons sugar
1/2 cup sifted all-purpose flour	1 egg, beaten
2 teaspoons baking powder	1 cup milk
1/2 teaspoon salt	1/4 cup vegetable oil

Heat oven to very hot (450°F.). Sift together corn meal, flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. Add egg, milk and oil. Pour into greased 9-inch square baking pan. Bake in preheated oven (450°F.) 20 to 25 minutes. Cool.

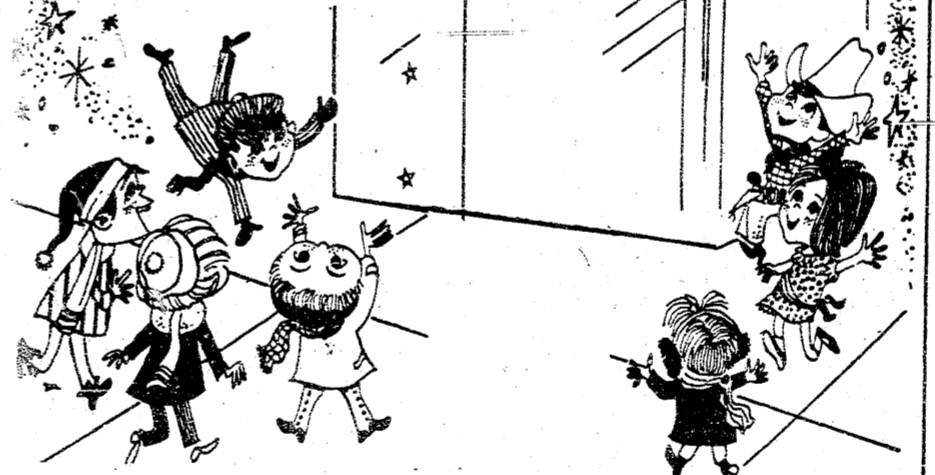

## Florence "Grandma" Kirk Been On Call for 25 Years

fifty years earlier she had been a neighbor near the farm, and so she sent help and the woman was found alone on the floor with a broken hip. Son Leonard had a similar experience when he received a call from a stuttering man at Pleasant Lake. Having trouble getting information he kept repeating that he must have the name and address and was told "Stop your damn questions and send the fire truck," then hung up. However, once again Chick knew the voice and was able to give the right address. At one time, with a fire in progress, the Ann Arbor Department received a call from this area with only the name of the street given, and to further complicate matters, Saline, Milan and Manchester all had to answer because without an address each had to search a part of the district to find the fire. Receiving a call from Ann Arbor one day that a woman had just remembered she shut and locked her door and left dinner on the stove cooking, the time involved in trying to get a key was too great, so Chick simply went out and tossed a stone through the window, climbed in and turned off the stove. To be ninety years old on the 20th of February, Grandma Kirk was born in 1882 in the Irish Hills. Daughter of the original settlers, she married Ferdinand Kirk in 1906 and moved to Grossman Rd. in Manchester Twp., living on what is now the Marvin Kirk farm. Six children were born of them, Sr. Jean Mildred, Sr. Vincent Marie, Robert, Marvin, Mildred, and Leonard. In 1946 Ferdinand died and Grandma moved to town where she has since made her home. "Grandma" to the whole town, this reporter had to ask her name, never having heard it before. Just a tiny mite, but with a straight back and firm will, sharp and alert, Grandma can still be seen working in the store and sometimes walking to Church. The best of our Pioneer heritage stands firm and solid, steady and dependable. Merry Christmas Grandma from everyone of us.
