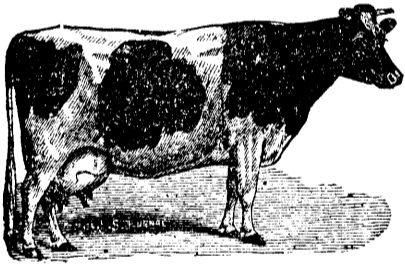

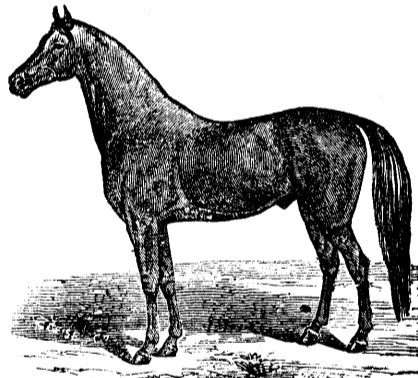

If elected I shall leave the question of a second term to the voters and shall not insist that it is due me by virtue alone of having held the office for one term BUT EXPECT IT TO BE DEPENDENT UPON MY "DELIVERING THE GOODS" BY EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATION OF THE OFFICE IN EVERY DEPARTMENT

If elected I shall endeavor to enforce all laws impartially, efficiently and economically. I shall also endeavor to reduce materially the expense of the prosecutor's office during the next two years and materially increase the percentage of Circuit Court convictions in criminal trial cases.

Congressional—United States Senator (for term beginning March 4, 1929) United States Senator (to fill vacancy) for unexpired term ending March 4, 1929; Representative in Congress for the Congressional district of which said township forms a part.

Legislative—One Senator in the State Legislature for the Senatorial District of which said township forms a part; one Representative in the State Legislature for the Legislative district of which said township forms a part.

County—Judge of Probate, Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff, County Clerk, County Treasurer, Register of Deeds, Circuit Court Commissioners, Drain Commissioner, 2 Coroners and a County Surveyor, as provided for by Act 351, P. A. 1925, as amended.

Relative to Opening and Closing of Polls

Act 351—Part IV—Chapter VIII
Public Acts of 1925

Section 1. On the day of any election the polls shall be opened at seven o'clock in the forenoon, or as soon thereafter as may be, and shall be continued open until five o'clock in the afternoon and no longer;

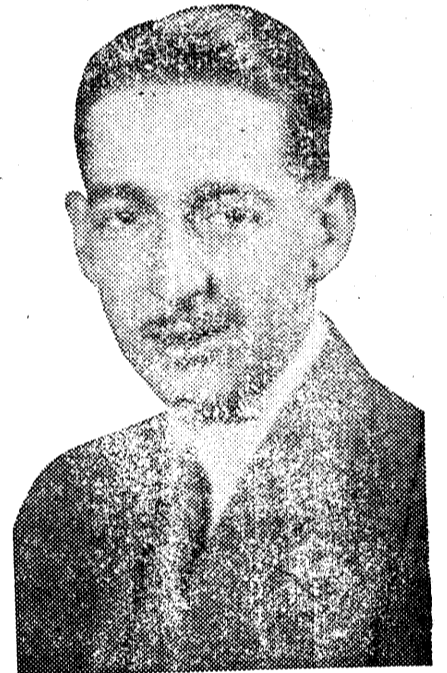
Provided, that in townships the board of inspectors of election may, in its discretion, adjourn the polls at twelve o'clock noon, for one hour, and that the township board in townships and the legislative body in cities and villages may by resolution adopted fifteen days prior to the election and published with the notice of the election, provide that the polls shall be kept open not later than eight o'clock in the evening of the same day.

THE POLLS of said election will open at 7 o'clock a. m. or as soon thereafter as may be, and will remain open until 5 o'clock p. m. on said day of election.
