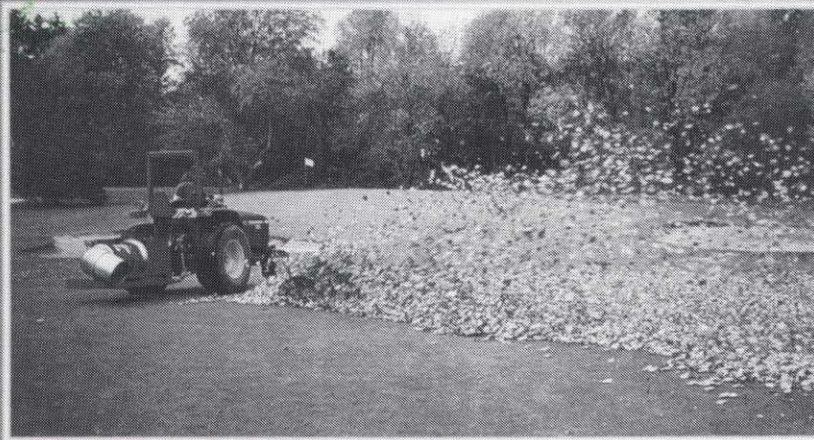

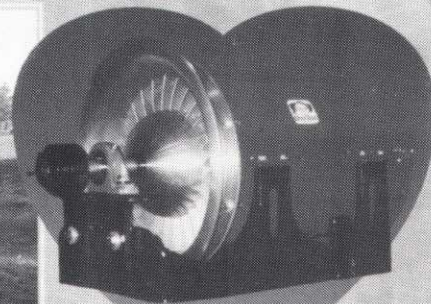

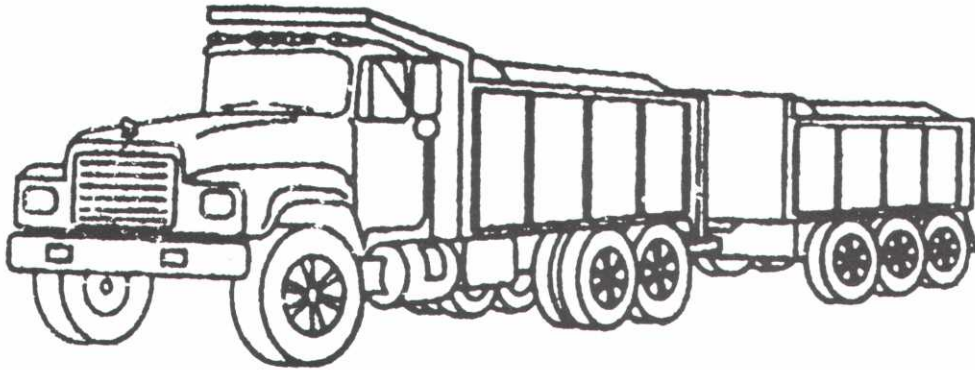

# 'Dream Team' Building 45 Holes at Cragun's

*First 18 Completed Rapidly at Gull Lake Resort*

A "dream team" assembled to build the 45-hole golf complex at Cragun's Resort on Gull Lake north of Brainerd certainly completed the first 18 holes rapidly.

From August 6, 1997, when the first yard of dirt was moved, to August 5, 1998, when owner Dutch Cragun hit the inaugural tee shot, it was exactly one year minus one day to get the first of two championship courses completed.

Naturally, there's still some fine-tuning to be accomplished, but the course officially will open on September 11 for limited play.

Another championship nine will be completed next year as well as a unique "reversible nine" which has yardages ranging from 100 to 240 yards and can be played clockwise or counterclockwise. Later, one more championship nine will complete the 45-hole layout.

Designed by Robert Trent Jones, Jr., Cragun's new, yet-to-be named courses provide still another attraction to the Brainerd Lakes area which is rapidly establishing itself as a golf destination with a variety of places to play and stay. (See "Golf Boom" story on Page 17.)

Describing Cragun's construction crew as a "dream team" organized to simultaneously handle various construction phases — such as cutting and filling, building tees, clearing and grubbing, irrigation or whatever — Tom Kientzle, CGCS, director of golf at Cragun's, said "We're proud of what we've accomplished thus far and we're all set to make it an outstanding facility."

Head Golf Course Superintendent Dan Steiger, who worked with Kientzle when the Marsh Nine was being built at Grand View Lodge, then went to Green Gables in Colorado before joining Cragun's construction team a year ago, echoes Kientzle's comments.

"We really have had great cooperation by all concerned," said Steiger. "We had a crew of about 30 during most of the summer, and they did a magnificent job. We also were provided with a great opportunity to do the work properly. We were able to purchase equipment when wanted and needed, and we had great support from our suppliers, too."

Working closely with Steiger were Matt McKinnon, formerly at Bemidji Town & Country Club, and Steve Jetvig,

who previously was a groundskeeper at Coors Field in Denver.

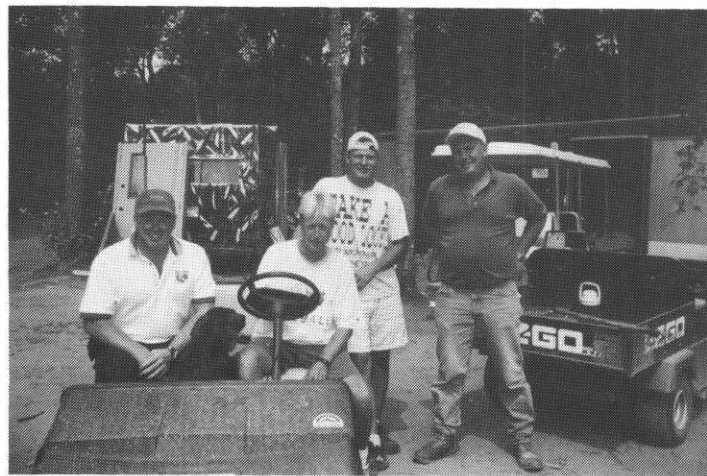
For Kientzle, the Cragun's project presented an appealing challenge, much like at Grand View where he was employed from 1984 to 1996 and helped build the 27 holes at

The Pines and was involved in the grow-in of grass at The Preserve. His family owns Birch Bay golf course, also located in the Brainerd lakes area.

Kientzle is enamored by several design features, such as having at least four tees on every hole with one, the 13th hole on the first 18, presenting an amphitheater of nine tees. Another on the third nine will have 11.

"Not only will this approach allow golfers to enjoy the course according to their abilities, but it also will allow us (the groundskeeping department) to care for the tee boxes properly," Kientzle said.

He also said he enjoys Jones' "goalkeeper" approach that has bunkers (like goalie mitts) blocking areas at various greens, thus forcing a player to circumvent the blocked areas.

Before the first tree was trimmed, Kientzle said, Cragun's

joined the Audobon program and adopted "a sustainable development program that protects and preserves a place to work and recreate." The Jones firm was hired in the Spring of 1997 after Dutch Cragun had reviewed three proposals.

Cragun, 66, has been as enthused as anyone about the overall design of the 45-hole complex, the construction progress and the sincere effort made by all concerned.

"I'm so excited I forgot about being 66," he said. "I'm revitalizing. After being in this business since I was eight years old, this is probably the most exciting time of my life."
