Fall Seeding time is just around the bend - -

If you will read the item on fall seeding in the enclosed issue of Turf Talks it will bring you up-to-date on the advantages of renewing your fairways (greens too if they were seeded) during the six weeks period just ahead. The tee and rough; even the lawn around the club house may also need touching up. If so you could not find a better combination than Scotts Seed and September.
