



COACH W. W. ALDERMAN Who has successfully discovered a method to control the mole cricket.

E ARE indebted to Coach W. W. Alderman, Recreational Director, and Mr. Hervey W. Laird, Manager of the Chamber of Commerce, Lakeland, Florida, for the following information concerning the control of the mole cricket about which we have had several inquiries. Coach Alderman has charge of the Cleveland Heights Golf Course at

Lakeland which is one of the best in the south and is kept in fine condition.

Writing us recently he says: "It is rather difficult to describe the mole cricket. It is a bug that looks similar to the cricket—can fly but burrows in the ground, and in its effect is similar to the mole in that it works just under the surface of the ground and eats its way through the roots of the grass.

"I have tried castor pomace, arsenate of lead and tobacco. So far I have had far greater results from the tobacco. I use about sixty pounds to the green and the application is put on about every twelve to fifteen days. I note that the tobacco not only eliminates the crickets but the greens that we have used it on are very much superior in the texture of grass.

"The tobacco I use is not the ordinary tobacco dust or stem but is the clippings from the Cigars. In the make of the cigar there is a certain amount of wrapper that has to be cut in the final wrapping. I get these from the cigar manufacturers of Tampa at sixty cents per hundred."
