Windsor Golf Club is an 18-hole course designed by Golfplan with Fred Bliss as principle architect. Operated by a private partnership, the club opened to the public in October, 1989. The course ranges from 5,500 to 6,650 yards from four sets of tees.

Since 1990, Windsor has been the home of the Nike Tour (formerly Hogan Tour), Sonoma County Open.

Rick Hanson is the golf course superintendent. He is 43-years-old, has three children and has been married for 21 years.

A graduate of Whitworth College, Spokane, Washington, Rick has been in the golf business for 15 years. He has been a superintendent for 8 years, the last five of which have been at Windsor.

Prior to getting into golf course management, Rick was a groundskeeper for the Los Angeles Dodgers.
