18-hole course were built in 1968; the second nine being completed a year later.

The Villages is a private course with a bit of a twist it is an "adult community," meaning all the residents must be 55 years of age or older. All 3600 residents are members of the club.

The course is open and designed for higher-handicap players. It looks easy, but the greens can be deceptive and are the most difficult part of the course. The water on eleven of the holes does not factor too much to the courses's difficulty.
