

CLOSED TRANSFER AND MIXING SYSTEMS: This is a condensed version of a paper put out by the University of California, Cooperative Extension Suggestions for Closed Transfer and Mixing Systems for Small Volume Users. California regulations require that employees handle toxic liquid pesticides (carrying the single word "Danger") through a closed transfer and mixing system. Such a closed system, designed to protect workers, should meet the following requirements:

1. There should be no loss of the pesticide and maximum protection to the worker while transferring the chemicals from the shipping container to the sprayer or mixing tank.
2. There should be a way to measure the pesticide to insure proper dosage.
3. There must be a way to rinse the container and the transfer system so there is no contamination hazard.

Advantages of the use of a closed system could include: increased worker safety; use of uncomfortable protective clothing may no longer be necessary; complex medical supervision may be reduced to a simple initial baseline cholinesterase test; more accurate pesticide measurement.

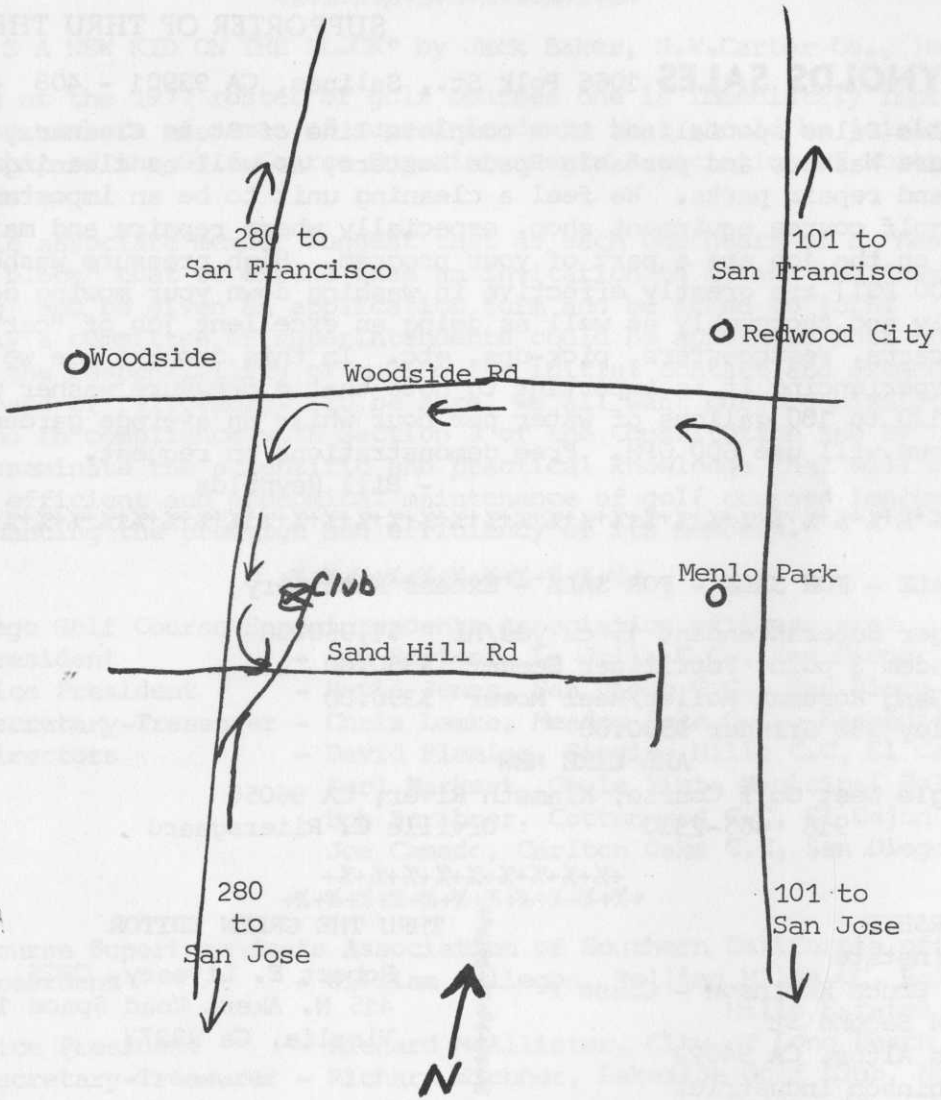
