And most recently, he has begun an ambitions tee renovation program.

Still, as members, we must remember all this was accomplished with only one assistant, a poor pump and watering system, and limited financial resources. But as the course improved so did the membership and revenue. We now have new, excellent equipment and maintenance facilities, and the future looks even brighter.

Tarsem has not only devoted his time and labor to our course but also has become an important member of our club. He takes part in all our club functions, throws darts for one of our teams, and represents the club as a Class Amember of the Superintendents Association. There isn't a member of the club that does not call him a friend.
