





MAY MEETING TO HIGHLIGHT **GOLF COURSE TREE ISSUES**



Golf following the meeting will be on a very limited tee time basis. Hope to see you at The Presidio!



Golf Courses Invited to Join the Audobon Green Golfer Challenge

Throughout 2007, Audubon International is inviting golf courses in the United States, Canada, and worldwide to take part in the Audubon Green Golfer Challenge. The challenge is simple: Get as many golfers as possible to pledge to take steps to support environmental stewardship while playing the game. From replacing divots to supporting the golf course's efforts to provide wildlife habitat and protect water resources, there are simple actions golfers can take which are good for the game, good for the golf course, and good for the environment.

Throughout the year, the pledges from participating golf courses will be collected and counted by Audubon International. Ongoing totals will be posted online. Prizes will be awarded to golf courses with the most golfers signed up by November 15, 2007, with winners in various categories (golf course type, region, etc.) announced at the end of 2007. Finally, golfers who take the pledge will also become eligible for a random drawing of prizes at the end of the year.

The year of 1948 got off to a good start when our president proposed a membership drive. A letter stating the purpose of our organization was drafted and sent to every Greens Committee Chairman, urging them to influence the Golf Course Superintendent to join our association. This drive resulted in attaining 14 new members, thus boosting membership to 71.6 35 are senoir members, 34 associate members, and 2 honorary members.


Dr. Frank Wong was a guest at the meeting. He gave us an update on the work that he is doing and then the board voted on donating \$4000 to help with the continuation of his research.
