## **INVENTIVE IDEA** speeds application



Special spraying jobs call for special equipment, and that in a nutshell is the reason Ted Weidenfeller designed a new spray boom that's simple, yet effective. It's one of those, "Gee, I wish I'd thought of that" ideas.

Weidenfeller, who's sales manager of Agricultural Services, Inc., in Minneapolis, points out that for spraying open areas such as parking lots, storage areas, sub-stations and the like, a different type of boom is needed. A hand or orchard-type sprayer is great for spot treatment. In areas filled with obstructions, OC or flood tips fill the bill.

However, Weidenfeller discovered that a boom for open areas, one that would treat large areas accurately and efficiently without leaving untreated strips and misses, and one man could handle with ease day after day, just wasn't available.

So, he set about designing his own. He came up with what he calls the "T type boom", a rig that applies a 6-foot wide spray strip at a rate of about 50 gallons per acre.

His T type boom is equipped with a quick-coupler, a good shut-off (a 31 gun jet), and is fabricated from  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch aluminum piping.

Overall length is 42 inches, including the coupler and gun jet. The horizontal boom, made of <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-inch aluminum pipe, is 60 inches long. A pressure gauge is mounted at the junction of the vertical and horizontal boom pipes, and is easily read by the operator.

Completely equipped, including four nozzles, the boom weighs only 5 pounds.

There are other advantages besides being lightweight.

By using four nozzles equipped with 50 mesh ball check strainers and 8005 tips, and spraying at 40 psi, a person walking at a normal gait applies a spray strip 6 feet wide at a rate of almost 50 gallons per acre.

"Thus, a 200-300 gallon spray will treat 4 to 6 acres of bare ground chemical in one filling, and this is about all a two-man crew can treat in a day when the sites are scattered," inventor Weidenfeller says.

## Government News

EPA Administrator Russell E. Train has notified 4,100 pesticide producers, formulators, distributors and registrants that <u>EPA</u> will soon be initiating an <u>auditing program</u> to examine selected toxicity test reports. He said it was the industry's responsibility to insure that all data submitted in support of registration are complete, accurate and valid.

The federal <u>quarantine for imported fire ant</u> has been amended to extend regulated areas in <u>parts of Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Mississippi, North Carolina,</u> <u>South Carolina, and Texas</u>. James O. Lee, deputy administrator of the USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, APHIS, said this action was necessary because the imported fire ant has spread to new areas in the seven states. Pest-risk articles---such as soil and used soil-moving equipment---must be inspected, treated if necessary, and certified free of pests by APHIS or state agricultural inspectors. The amendment puts movement restrictions for the first time on all or part of the following counties: Colbert and Lauderdale, Ala.; Calhoun and Miller, Ark.; Barrow, Burke, Clarke, Forsyth, Greene, and McDuffie, Ga.; Lenoir, N. C.; McCormick and Newberry, S.C.; Bee, Bell, Blanco, Bowie, Camp, Falls, Freestone, Gillespie, Jim Wells, Milam and Refugio, Tex.

Scientists at the Georgia Institute of Technology will <u>study solar heat</u> <u>collectors and storage systems</u> under a cooperative agreement with the USDA. Under the agreement terms, the Georgia scientists will have one year and \$39,499 to design, build and evaluate several solar collector and storage systems using a rockbed system to store heat for use in heating greenhouses, farm buildings or rural residences. USDA's Agricultural Research Service will sponsor the study with funds from the Energy Research and Development Administration.

EPA has asked for ideas and comments from the public on ways to address the problem posed by <u>contamination of drinking water</u> supplies by organic chemicals. In an Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, EPA says interested people should submit written data, views or arguments to the Agency's Office of Water Supply (WH-550), Criteria and Standards Division, 401 M. Street, SW., Washington, D. C. 20460.

Scientists at Washington State University's Irrigated Agriculture Research and Extension Center, Prosser, will seek <u>controls for the black vine weevil</u>, a serious grape pest, under a cooperative agreement with the U. S. Department of Agriculture. USDA's Agriculture Research Service (ARS) will provide \$5,000 for the 18-month study. The scientists plan to evaluate the effectiveness of carbofuran on the weevils. Several treatments using various strengths of carbofuran will be tested. Samples of treated grapes, juice and pomace will be taken for later evaluation for residues and the effects of flavor. Dr. W. W. Cone, an entomologist at the university, is the principal investigator and Billy A. Butt, ARS entomologist, Yakima, Wash., will represent ARS.



## WATER: COLORADO'S SHRINKING COMMODITY

## Demands grow, costs soar and availability dwindles

"In this country, water is it," explains Dr. J. D. Butler, a full professor of horticulture at Colorado State University (CSU), Ft. Collins. "We talk about water first out here. If you don't have it, you don't have anything. If you don't have the water, you don't do it."

This precious commodity of the semi-arid red stone state has always been a highly volatile and serious issue. Never at a premium in Colorado's history, Dr. Butler says, "In all those movies of the West, you saw men fighting over horses but they were really fighting over water." And the fight continues today.

Colorado's scenic wonder and temperate climate have lured many new people who create a heightening demand upon its water supply. As competition increases for water for food, irrigation, lawns, personal and home uses, new provisions and tactics appear critical.

Currently, almost 42 percent of Denver's municipal and industrial supply enriches the lawns of city residents, according to a 1972 study by Woodward and Dr. Butler says costs for maintaining an 18-hole golf course with water runs between \$30,000 to \$40,000 a year.

The irony is that homeowners who demand lush carpets of lawn are the same people who are creating a water shortage that will make the cost of water prohibitive for turf.

It is not likely that irrigation will change much as a means to replenish agriculture and shrinking turf and croplands except for some grass adaptation but priorities may be necessary for proper use of water.

According to Donald L. Miles, extension irrigation engineer for CSU, 'agriculture, Colorado's largest industry, has shrunk from a 1970 all time high acreage of 3,380,000 acres to the present 3,100,000 acres. The loss is primarily to subdivision development.

With an increasing flow of new residents, Denver and eastern Colorado are handling greater demands upon water tracts set aside as many as 100 years ago. Denver now imports water from the western slope but has tapped nearly all its available sources. There are no water districts in the state and metering is done in only a few areas.

Individuals and sodfarmers can get water rights, the rights to use one acre flood a year or roughly 327,000 gallons of water. While giving the person the right to use water, water rights don't provide water. That is negotiated through other channels.

The individual's water right is owned by the city which levies rates as it is charged.

Prices for water rights may vary from \$2500 in Denver, \$600 to \$2500 on the eastern sector to a very low price in the water rich western territory, Miles says. Denver homeowners may pay up to \$10,000 a month for treated water while sodfarmers are charged alike and have a percentage of the cost of water. "It's mostly a matter of who can pay the most," Miles notes. "People pay more to have a little green around them than agriculture thinks it's worth." Continued on page 14

Some landowners draw water from wells and have faced more restrictions for this practice. In 1965 small domestic wells were granted an exemption from registration if they pumped up to 50 gallons a minute for use in domestic, livestock and irrigation on no more than one acre of land. Today permits for wells are only granted in areas where water hasn't been appropriated for mass use or where the wells don't interfere with existing water rights. It is nearly impossible to get permission for drilling a new well today and some wells can only serve domestic, not irrigation, needs.

Such legislation reaches some

segments of the problem but leaves others uncharted. Miles points to unorthodox housing construction as a major problem. "Many of the areas where subdivisions are placed are going on extremely salty soil," he says. "This as much as anything I see as limiting the use of water for lawn purposes."

Lawn irrigation in such places brightens lawns while burning out the water. "If the grass uses three quarters of the water, the other quarter contains all the salt," he explains. It percolates through the earth and "is four times as salty as that (water) you put on." De-salting is an alternative although costs make it prohibitive, Miles stresses.

### Less thirsty grasses hold possible solution

If and when Colorado sodgrowers line up for tank rationing of water for their crops, turf management studies at Colorado State University (CSU) in Ft. Collins may provide knowledge to ease the situation.

It is hoped these studies will supply grasses that can live with lower quality of water of effluent, run off wells or even brackish colored water.

As part of the PERC (Plant Environmental Research Center) of the Department of Horticulture at CSU, two open plots resembling football fields are the carefully controlled carpet homes of experimental Kentucky bluegrasses. Some 30 varieties grow there in striped patterned sections measuring 10 feet by 10 feet each.

Now in the second year, the turf plots support Adelphi, Nugget, Merion, Code 95, Arboretum, Chem blue, fescues, perennial ryegrasses, Prado, Park and Windsor grasses, among others.

Dr. J. D. Butler, a full professor of horticulture at CSU, is applying both anatomical and physiological research in the Kentucky bluegrass studies and is borrowing his results from his ongoing altitude studies. He also is experimenting with turfgrass from the western slope and plains of Colorado.

Many factors were judged before choosing the grasses to reflect both the soil of the plot areas and Colorado's soil problems. Types of soils and grasses were major points.

In considering these turfgrasses, Dr. Butler stressed that uniform, good soil is difficult to find in Colorado due to disturbances caused by construction and use of low quality land. Colorado soils often differ in water storage and availability. Poorer quality soils often show a very slow rate of infiltration while The question is whether building should be permitted on such land and if lawn irrigation should be cut back, if not outlawed, there. Colorado's natural salts are only compounded as a problem because of such practices.

As a step in the right direction, subdividing is now illegal on parcels smaller than 32 acres unless water and sewage services are already available from the outside.

Other alternatives are allowing lawn irrigation only on alternate days for houses having even or odd street numbers. Some cities are using re-used agricultural water. There even is a greater likelihood that dual water systems may spring up in cities with pipes transporting high quality water into the house for tubs, showers, wash basins and the kitchen sink. A second pipe would bring in reclaimed sewage water for flushing toilets, cars and lawn irrigation. The reclaimed water would be biologically pure but would have a rather high concentration of dissolved salts, Miles speculates.

Miles also views more responsible use of landscaping in housing and population limits and distribution in Colorado as a means to better control for using water.

At present, however, re-developing turfgrasses and re-educating the population seem the most workable alternatives. Fancier and more efficient equipment won't help. There are no plans for allocation of water but Dr. Butler believes economics may well dictate higher priorities of water to food production, slurry transportation of coal and practices such as oil shale processing.

The issue of water is very political, though vital. Legislators shy away from it since an appointment to the Executive Committee of the Joint Water Committee is often followed by their ouster by voters in the next election. Since Colorado's legislature provides the governor the option of delegating topics for the even numbered years, it is not likely that the water issue will appear in 1976. Even though, "water is it," perhaps too much it.

turfgrasses having good root systems add to the best rate of water stored in the lower soil levels.

Where drought is critical, the types of grasses are important. Only a few grasses are able to grow where heavy droughts are severe or where it is impractical or impossible to irrigate. But these are often low quality turfgrasses and may not stay drought tolerant without some irrigation beyond average rainfall. A turfgrass' uses may also be limited by the amount of traffic it can endure.

While drier areas prize a grass' ability to remain alive during drought above its ability to stay green into dry periods, less arid regions place more value upon the grass that stays green into dry periods. In studying the grasses, criteria of the grass' tendencies to stay green into drought, and if its foliage dessicates, dies or returns to normal growth with enough rainfall are evaluated.

Colorado does have hearty native turfgrasses such as grama and buffalograss but these are judged undesirable because they turn brown and don't give good ground cover. The new Kentucky bluegrasses should provide good cover, color and drought resistance.

The CSU bluegrasses were also chosen for their tolerance of eight to 15 inches of rainfall a year (15 inches being a normal year), how well they stayed green in dry times, if they formed a thick turf, and their texture and overall performance, qualities Dr. Butler and his research team of Peter Dernoeden and Mohammed Ali Harivandi have continued into the program.

Research by Dernoeden showed common bluegrasses are the most drought resistant and that these tolerant cultivars grow fairly quickly. Drought tolerance also figured into stomata size and location and the length of bulliform cells.

Other studies Dernoeden conducted note that mowing can affect drought tolerance. Since more water tends to be applied as if in compensation for low mowing, any good features of turfgrasses are cancelled. Half of the CSU plots at the horticulture center are trimmed to three quarters of an inch while the rest are cut to one and one-half inch.

In handling the project, the researchers also experiment with the thatch and soil fertility. Thatch is important since it may drive water into useless runoff. The new varieties should help prevent this if they have deep roots.

Although Colorado isn't alone in its water problem since Arizona and California also contend with similar situations, the state does have special problems due to its altitude, cooler nights, light intensity, soil salts and high alkaline content. The effects of soil salts and salty water are now being researched by Harivandi at two Denver golf courses in another project which will affect future Colorado turfgrasses.

Although no specific target date is set for the study, when it ends original grasses, not hybrids or mutations will probably go into commercial production. Production is expected by 1981.

### Where have all the flowers gone?

Some flowering plants may be headed for the fate of the passenger pigeon: extinction. The cause, say biologists at Notre Dame, is Man's alteration of his environment.



A recent study by scientists at Notre Dame University suggests that certain flowering plants may become casualties of "progress."

"More and more flowering plants are falling into the categories of threatened and endangered," said Professor Theodore J. Crovello, chairman of Notre Dame's Department of Biology. "Threatened" is a less severe classification than "endangered."

"As Man moves into new areas and alters the environment, by draining areas for farming, for example, flowers decline and disappear. Orchids that grew in Indiana not many years ago are gone."

The conclusion that certain flowers are disappearing is based on a three-year study that used an IBM computer to analyze 35,000 botanical specimens collected in North America over the last 180 years. The specimens were from collections at 75 museums and universities across the country.

"Our study is helping determine the status of certain plants," said Dr. Crovello. "Research, for example, indicates that relatives of the mustard are disappearing. On the other hand, we might find that a species thought to be extinct or disappearing had been mislabeled in some collections; or hadn't been collected for some years; or exists in only a few collections, but is still thriving in the wild."

The Notre Dame researchers have supplied endangered species information to scientists in Ohio studying plants of the mustard family there. Preliminary research indicates that while some plant species in Ohio are threatened and endangered, others can be removed from the list. Analysis of certain "spring flora" such as various types of spring watercress shows some are disappearing while others are plentiful. Another part of the study, the Flora Indiana Project (FLIP), is focuses on the 2,500 different species of flowers found in Indiana.

The biologists built their files of information by entering names of plants, when and where found, environmental conditions at time of collection, and other information. The IBM System/370 Model 158 produces reports by states and counties showing numbers of plants gathered by century and decade since 1800.

"As you look back into history, collectors' records become sketchy," said Dr. Crovello. "A botanist might simply have noted 'picked up by the Missouri River' or 'collected in Indiana territory' and just recorded the year. Today, researchers provide more accurate records, sometimes even the street address. Still, we see plants shrinking in geographic distribution over' time — the indication of an endangered species.

"This is more than just an aesthetic loss: Man benefits significantly from certain plant species, particularly those that supply important medicines. Yet most plants have not even begun to be analyzed for products useful to people. Who knows what potentially valuable chemicals we are losing with every species that becomes extinct.

"Urbanization and other activities of Man can irrevocably alter the environment, and this forces us to set priorities."

### Protect irreplaceable trees from lightning destruction

A blinding flash. An ear-piercing crack. Suddenly, one of your most valuable trees is destroyed by lightning — one of the most destructive forces of nature. In its 70-year history, The Davey Tree Expert Company, Kent, Ohio, has seen the results of countless lightning strikes. And, again this year summer electrical storms have taken their toll of hundreds of trees throughout the country.

According to John W. Joy, Davey vice president, "Tree owners can protect their valued trees by turning them into giant lightning rods." The cost of installing lightning protection is only a fraction of what a fine tree may be worth in terms of actual dollars. Remember, a house can be replaced in every detail, but the grand old trees around it ... never. Although it is not possible to


Although it is not possible to prevent a tree from being struck by lightning, it is possible to equip a tree so that lightning will be conducted harmlessly into the soil.

Here is how professionals install a lightning protection system: A copper cable is attached from the highest parts of the tree to the ground, running down the trunk in as nearly a straight line as possible. Branch conductors also are run from the main limbs in the upper part of the tree and attached to the main truck connector. (See illustrations.)

Ground cables, buried in narrow trenches, are attached to the main conductor and extend from the base of the tree like the spokes of a wheel. A copper rod, attached to the ground cable, is driven into the ground at the end of each trench. The purpose of the spoke-like ground connection is to pick up or distribute the current beyond and below the roots which are as sensitive to injury as the top of the tree.

Within a clump of trees, terminals should be attached to one or more of the tallest trees in the group. Also, if a tree is close to and taller than your home, permitting the lightning to follow the treegrounded route might avoid a strike on the house.

Joy pointed out that trees are constantly growing upward and outward each year and changes occur in their structure, character and physical being. Therefore, lightning protection installations should be checked every four or five years.



For lightning protection a special conductor cable is attached to the highest parts of the tree (left) and runs along major branches down the tree trunk. The ground system (right) consists of an extension of the main trunk cable to a point beyond the main root system and is attached to a rod driven to the required depth.

## New company tests aerial lifts

A growing number of accidents are being recorded by users of aerial lift equipment. Nine of every ten such mishaps come about because of mechanical failure. Seldom does the insulation which is designed to protect the operator fail when a high voltage line is accidently contacted. Insulation is more likely to be failsafe than the mechanical phases of the unit.

Such are the findings of a new company known as American Safety Test at Morrow, Georgia, formed only for testing and inspecting aerial lift equipment. The units, known by such names as bucket trucks, cherry pickers or aerial lifts, need regular checks and service. Russell W. Tupper and Warren E. Tupper founders of the company, have more than 35 years of experience in working with aerial lift units.

They report owners and operators are almost totally concerned with the insulated components of such equipment and many are unaware of the fact that mechanical failure is responsible for more accidents.

Their new safety testing and inspection program naturally includes what is commonly known as the dielectric test for both insulated aerial lift components and tools. This is basic, however, they go beyond this with five other major steps — one of which is a loading and stability test.

A third test is the complete analysis of hydraulic oil. Many times after a machine has been in service for an extended period or has been used under stress, the oil contains excess moisture, acid or picks up foreign materials which affect the reliability of the aerial equipment.

Another step and probably the most critical in preventing accidents and reducing costly repairs, is a complete professional visual and operational check of the total aerial lift, accessories, tools and safety equipment.

Other steps include a verbal question and answer period with the

operator and crew which confines discussions to safety instructions and proper operaton of the equipment. It is important to point out that during these tests and inspections, the inspectors do not in any way convey the negative items to be reported to the operating crew or any other personnel present at the time of the inspection.

The next and last step is a practical and easy to understand report which is given the owners. This is a confidential report and is broken down into separate listings for safety hazards and mechanical discrepancies.

Safety hazards need to be corrected immediately according to AST. Mechanical discrepancies not considered hazardous immediately can be corrected at the regularly scheduled service. The AST officials also point out that the company does not make mechanical repairs or in any way service equipment. Theirs is a test service only — geared to spot potential problems and prevent accidents.

### FROM THE CAMPUS\_\_\_\_\_ Mulching made easy

The virtues of mulches are more than skin deep, according to Dr. Charles Dunham, extension horticulturist at the University of Delaware. Mulching can control weeds, conserve water and protect plants, as well as add beauty through a variety of available materials.

One benefit provided by mulches is water conservation. They cut evaporation losses by retaining moisture and capture water that would ordinarily run off in hard showers. Plants are protected from splashing mud and dirt that can be a problem to both vegetables and flowers.

There is a diversity of possible mulching materials, mostly organic but also inorganic, such as aluminum foil which is helpful in protecting plants from insect damage. Dunham claims that as long as water can penetrate and the mulch does not pack to exclude air from the soil it should work. Organic mulches break down at different rates and enrich the soil in the process, but if there is a high ratio of carbon to nitrogen a temporary nitrogen shortage can result, necessitating the addition of extra nitrogen. Sawdust and straw will do this.

For flower beds, house and patio, appearance and cost are probably important factors in choosing a mulch. There are some readily available that will enhance the looks of flowers and shrubs. Bark and wood chips are ideal mulches especially for shrubs and ground covers. They are attractive and long lasting. Use coarser grades for trees and shrubs and finer, smaller sizes for flowers and ground covers. Four to six inches of mulch is needed for long lasting weed control.

Licorice root sold as Right Dress is one of the best mulches for flower beds.

Cocoa bean hulls are available in

some areas. These tend to pack so should not be used more than two inches deep. They also are sometimes toxic to azaleas. However, for many plants they are satisfactory and attractive.

Grass clippings are one of the cheapest and most available mulches. The problem with grass clippings is that used fresh they tend to rot and pack tightly, warns Dunham. This can be overcome by drying the grass first or stirring repeatedly until dry after they are in place. Grass clippings are probably best in the vegetable garden. Straw is also excellent in the garden.

Pine needles are an attractive mulch especially good for azaleas.

### Midges for weed control


University of Idaho scientists have released 25,000 insects in the hope they will destroy some plants.

The insects are skeleton weed midges and are roughly the size of fruit flies. The university has imported thousands of them from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Biological Weed Control Laboratory at Albany, Cal. to combat skeleton weed, a range pest that competes with forage grasses and crops.

"A few years ago there were just scattered skeleton weed plants found in the Payette River canyons around Banks and Garden Valley," said Dr. William Barr, professor of entomology at the university. "Since then, that small population has mushroomed out all over the canyons between Banks and Lowman and even over into the Stanley Basin."

"The steep terrain in the canyons makes chemical control of skeleton weed dangerous and expensive," said Barr, "We brought in the midges because they have a definite potential for biological control and they're easy to rear. We don't really expect the insects to control the weed completely. But our plant scientists are working with a strain of rust disease that attacks skeleton weed specifically, and we hope that a combination of the insects and the rust will provide some measure of control."









The locks are closed and the digging process begins. Notice the stabilizers pictured behind the left rear tire—these stabilizers (on each side) are especially valuable in loading on soft ground.





### Glyphosate, Paraquat Effects On Seed Germination Studied

Effects of glyphosate and paraquat on turfgrass seed germination were evaluated recently in research conducted at Beltsville, Md., Agricultural Research Center carried out by Dayton L. Klingman and J. J. Murray.

Tests showed that glyphosate caused little effect on germination of Kentucky bluegrass, red fescue and tall fescue when applied directly over the seed on the soil surface.

Paraquat sprayed directly over the seed on the soil surface prevented germination of most of the seeds on the three grass species. Covering seeds on the soil surface with clippings from grass turf sprayed with paraguat greatly reduced germination. About half of those that germinated either died later or were severely chlorotic, it was reported in Weed Science. Covering seeds on the surface of the soil with clippings from turf that had been sprayed with glyphosate did not significantly reduce the number of seedlings established.

### Artificial Turf Makes Gains In Expanding Sales Market

"Plastic grass," artificial turf, may take its lumps from NFL owners, football players and stadium owners but it is finding plenty of running room in other markets.

The turf manufacturers are shifting the market from football stadium into other sales areas and finding it greener there. American Biltrete now sells a covering for tennis courts, gymnasiums and in other indoor and outdoor uses while Monsanto Co.'s Astroturf is enjoying a new market in automobile floors and thresholds, patios, pool decks, putting greens and grave coverings. Highway medians and landscaping are the recent domains of 3M's Tartan product. Its Tartan Turf rated highest for safety trials on football fields it covers.

Although players complain of skin burns, injuries and poor performances caused by artificial turf, and have had some bad experiences as in the case of Miami, Fla., which threw out \$250,000 worth of two year old, treacherous, slippery, and fading turf, the future isn't closed. Since natural grass can't withstand punishment by play, research will likely try to develop a safe and easy playing material.

### Trees Provide Varied Uses As Insulatory Energy Savers

The use of trees as shade devices extends for centuries but now a Cleveland, Ohio contractor is suggesting their use as insulatory and energy saving helps for the home.

As part of his check list to cut energy needs for heating homes he builds as much as 45 percent, Robert F. Schmitt suggests planting evergreen material on the building's north side with extensive use of deciduous trees to the south. This is beneficial, he says, since the evergreens help shield out the winter wind and chill as the deciduous trees allow direct sunshine. In summer, the deciduous provide shade for the house so less air conditioning is needed.

### Gypsy Moths Controlled With New Market Chemical

Thompson-Howard Chemical Company has introduced a new chemical product, Dimilin chitin inhibitor, for control of gypsy moths.

When applied by air at low levels, the chemical reported nearly 100 percent control, based upon larval kill and egg mass counts. It kills the pests within two or three days when they reach a new molt and continues control for two years by preventing egg masses from being deposited. The chemical has EPA granting registration, causes very low incidence of environmental effects and breaks down in soil with 50 percent degradation in several days.

### Supers Get News Update On Hyperodes Weevil

Golf managers can arm themselves with new knowledge about the hyperodes weevil, according to the Metropolitan Golf Course Superintendents Association.

Dr. H. Tashino, Cornell University, addressed an audience of the MGCSA concerning his research of the weevil since 1972.

Dr. Tashino's research in the weevil's life cycle points to to their overwintering as mature adults in the bases of fescue tufts. They generally spend this time beneath trees or other protected areas. With the advent of warm weather, the adults travel into areas infested with *Poa Annua* and feed eat the leaves. At this time, damage is not very serious.

During April and May, the insects leave their eggs on leaf sheaths and the larva devour stem tissue following their five stage metamorphosis. After eating the stem tissue, the pests eat the crown at the plant's base causing greater, more visible damage. The larva then progress into a pupa and adult. They are visible at night in the beams of a flashlight.

Dr. Tashino is now studying the life span of the Hyperodes to see if they have more than one generation and more than one species. He is also studying the activity of the weevil in comparison with the flowering period of dogwood and other common plants.



### Natural Enemies Studied As Alternative Pest Control

Instead of resorting solely to pesticides to control insect pests, science is now developing means of control through the predatory and parasite relationship of natural pest enemies.

Dr. Frank Gilstrap, a scientist with the Department of Entomology at Texas A & M University, now controls populations of spider mites, tiny red insects which destroy houseplants, by introducing Phytoseiulus persimilus, a beneficial mite species, the spider mite's natural enemy. The predator mites eat all the spider mites and starve after their task is through. They may be brought back again if spider mites return.

Such processes are also used in controlling pests which form galls on ornamental plants and trees. Gordon W. Frankie, also with the Department of Entomology, uses beneficial wasps to feast upon the small wasps, flies, caterpillars or beetles that lay their eggs or feed on plant tissue, forming galls. The galls are not harmful to plant tissue but are considered unsightly. Scientists theorize that secretions of chemicals from the insect's body create abnormal growth when they react to the plants' chemicals.

### EPA Gives Daconil Approval; Rate Reduction Underway

EPA has given approval for a rate reduction for Diamond Shamrock's Daconil 2787 Flowable Fungicide.

The company has changed rates from six to eight ounces per 1,000 sq. ft. to four to eight ounces per 1,000 sq. ft. Other curative rates will stay the same.

Daconil is used on golf course and ornamental turf grass. It is used to treat dollar spot, helminthosporium leaf spot and melting out.

### USDA Develops Polymer Used Against Weeds, Insects

The USDA has developed a new film-forming polymer for creating barriers against weeds or insects.

alcohol and a starch compound, the pesticide-polymer dries to an invisible film after being applied as a spray on soil or plants. A polymer is a compound created by combining small molecules or units to form large molecules.

According to William B. Roth, Agricultural Research Service (ARS) scientist, the polymer film won't dissolve in water. It keeps the pesticide in a barrier that will destroy emerging weeds or attacking insects and minimizes environmental pollution by reducing pesticide runoff and evaporation. After the pesticide is exhausted, the film decomposes into natural soil components.

The new polymer also increases the effectiveness of a commercial herbicide and needs a low rate of herbicide application to stop grass weed growth. It was as successful as greater applications and amounts of herbicide without the polymer. With the polymer, the herbicide didn't require mixing with soil to prevent evaporation. Instead, the herbicidepolymer was sprayed on the soil surface and dried as a weed-emergence barrier.

Roth developed the polymer from a viscous product which was found by Edwin N. Davis, a microbiologist, and Lowell L. Wallen, a chemist, at the Northern Center. Their studies revealed the bacteria in activated sludge form a thick, black product when methyl alcohol is mixed and aerated with the sludge.

In other actions, Roth adds the pesticide to the sludge-alcohol and combines it with dialdehyde starch as a cross-linking agent. The starch compound was another Northern Center discovery and is marketed as a paper strengthening agent. The pesticide-containing polymer may be added to water for spraying on soils or plants so it dries to the film barrier. These could be dried as films or sheets in the manufacturing plant and used in solid forms.

This is the second pesticidecontrol development from the USDA ARS Northern Regional Research Center since encapsulating chemicals with starch xanthate were announced in May.

Roth is now preparing studies to form delayed reaction and on-target pellets for the polymer.

### 350,000 Acres of Timber Affected by Pitch Canker

Forest experts are still baffled by the outbreak of pitch canker disease in Volusia and Flagler counties in Florida and the southeast.

The disease affects shade and ornamental pine in addition to forest pine.

According to the latest esti-(Continued on page 70)

mates, some 350,000 acres of slash pine in these two counties are affected by the destructive disease, representing a potential timber growth loss of nearly \$2 million. Less severe pitch canker infections are showing up in other areas of Florida and the southeast.

A *fusarium* fungus is the prime suspect in causing the disease, but no one is certain how it is spread and there are no known controls available at present, according to a University of Florida forest pathologist.

First observed in 1945, the disease has occurred periodically over the years, seemingly at random. During the last serious outbreak in 1969, many trees were infected, but few died. Many trees actually recovered. The present rate of spread, however, has been particularly alarming, says Dr. Robert A. Schmidt, associate professor with the Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (IFAS) at the UF.

"We are presently experiencing a high incidence of pitch canker in slash pine plantations and seed orchards. Entire crops are involved and tree mortality is very high in some areas. Heretofore, only a few terminal branches were attacked and tree mortality was not severe," he explains.

### Environmental Plant List, Index, Offered by Society

The American Horticulture Society has published a series of valuable publications relating to plants and its own history in horticulture studies.

The educational Horticultural Committee of the Society recently printed "Environmentally Tolerant Trees, Shrubs and Ground Covers," a 30-page listing of environmentally tolerant plants for all 10 U.S. hardiness zones. It is of special interest to public planting agencies dealing with high pollution levels and such other factors as human and animal traffic, financial restrictions, growing conditions and maintenance.

An index of 50 years of the National Horticulture Magazine, Vols. 1-38, 1922-1959, and American Horticultural Magazine, Vols. 39-50, 1960-1971, is now available.

The reference tool is 109 pages long and is a complete grouping of all issues. It was produced by Dr. Richard A. Howard, Director, Arnold Arboretum, and the American Horticultural Society Cumulative Index Committee.

# Genetic information needed for metropolitan trees

Progressive arborists and nurserymen have demonstrated impressive gains from exploiting genetic variation in certain characteristics of street trees. But the authors of a recent report suggest it is time for a more comprehensive approach, not only to make fuller use of these gains, but to achieve even greater genetic progress.

The report was prepared at Pennsylvania State University by H. D. Gerhold, professor of forest genetics; A. J. Long, former assistant professor of forest genetics; and M. E. Demeritt, former research assistant.

"The metropolitan regions of the Northwest offer diverse, and increasingly inhospitable, environments for trees," their report says. "Stresses include not only the familiar ones — adverse soils, droughts, freezes and disease organisms — but also other insults that accompany urbanization such as air pollutants



and deicing salts. Only fragmentary information is available about the effects of such stresses on the health of various species and clones, and little is in a form that can be readily applied."

They set up a genetic information system, with the principal components including:

 Taxonomic categories species, varieties, clones.

• Tree characteristics — appearance traits, adaptive traits.

• Environments of trees — hardiness zones, planting situations, urban stresses, diseases and insects.

• Organizations — municipalities, highway departments, nurseries, seed companies, government and university research agencies, arboreta.

They saw the principal functions of the genetic information system as follows:

• To organize performance tests of important trees at representative geographic locations.

• To obtain performance test data periodically on important characteristics from cooperating specialists.

• To interpret performance data and other pertinent data, transforming it into practical predictions of tree qualities in various environments.


• To distribute performance predictions periodically to cooperating individuals and organizations.

• To analyze for nurserymen trends in planting rates of species and clones.

• To analyze for breeders relative needs for improving various characteristics.

They surveyed arborists and nurserymen and several dimensions of metropolitan tree planting in 13 northeastern states were defined. About 100,000 trees were planted annually from 1962 to 1972 along highways in this region and about 200,000 were planted by municipal agencies — together an investment of \$12 million.

# With a little bit of luck . . .

### Fred Slagle transformed 200 acres into Ohio's toughest 72 par course with unorthodox methods by mick baker

With common sense, good luck and God's help, what can one man do?

Three years ago Fred Slagle started to build a golf course for himself. He took 200 acres of rolling farmland in northeastern Ohio, complete with 10,000 white pines and other trees native to that scenic area, and turned it into a blossoming championship course with 13 lakes, 14 water holes and 62 sand traps.

He must have done something right, because the course has been rated the hardest 72 par course in the state three months after it opened. Its nine-month-old turf was unbelievable to those with two or three-year-old courses and the envy of some with older ones.

Although Slagle attributes the success to "common sense, a lot of good luck and conditions that can only be called God's help," his foresight and preparation, as well as what some call his creative genius, have played an important role in the transition of a tract of rural countryside in Madison, Ohio into Thunder Hill Country Club, which is worthy of being called a resort.

"I've been successful by just starting to do it," says Slagle, a real estate broker who had never built a golf course before. "I never intended to build a championship golf course, but I like a challenge and I didn't want to cater to the average golfer. I wanted a course with interest and challenge."

So three years and \$1.5 million later he has exactly that. Other builders may not benefit much from his good luck, but a little of his "common sense" philosophy might very well help some. A unique aspect of the course is the extensive use of lakes and watersheds. Fifteen of its 60 acres of fairways are under water.

The hilly terrain has a topography naturally suited for lakes and ponds. Instead of using tile or open ditches to drain the course, Slagle decided to dam up the swells and let the water run off the predominantly clay soil into them, forming watersheds and lakes.

Use of water in this manner has other advantages. It beautifies the course, adds more hazards and saves maintenance costs, since 15 of the 60 acres of fairways do not have to be cut, seeded or fertilized. It also saves a step in construction since little tile must be put in. Slagle only used about ten percent of the tile that a comparably sized course would have needed. He said the expense of building the lakes enabled him "to spend money more wisely to have a more beautiful course."

The presence of one of those lakes saved the builder more than he was expecting it to - about \$150,-000 in green mix to be precise. The lake was losing water and he suspected the presence of porous material. His grass consultant discounted the possibility of sand, saying the area was entirely clay. Slagle dug four holes five feet into the ground near the lake with a bulldozer and came up with a bucket of soil that was analyzed as a good combination for green mix, minus peat moss. Slagle was happy and the consultant was shocked.

Preparation and the right equipment were two key elements in the course's construction. "The secret of our success was careful soil preparation," said Slagle, adding that 600 soil samples were taken at the course. They were taken before disturbing the land, after moving it and just before seeding. After each sample was taken, corrections were made to bring the soil up to ideal growing conditions.

Some 500,000 yards of dirt were moved during construction and Slagle was careful where he put it. When he removed topsoil from an area he immediately dumped, where it would be eventually needed, rather than leaving piles and coming back to them later. After damming up the swells to be filled with water, he took the topsoil and added it to the tee areas. He claims this bit of foresight will keep his tees in better condition and give the course variability.

The larger tees provide the opportunity to move the pins more often, thus insuring minimal use to any particular spots on the tees. The extra topsoil also allowed him to build tiers on the tees, as many as six on some. The pins can be set in such a number of places that shots can be changed. "We can change the tees so the shots are different everytime," said Slagle, "and the golfer can be facing a whole new course." This is to keep Thunder Hill from becoming a boring course, which he claims can cause golfers to stop concentrating.

When he realized how much soil would have to be moved, Slagle decided to buy the needed equipment and do his own moving. To have had it contracted would have cost upward from \$1.25 a yard. Buying the equipment was a fortunate choice for him in present market

conditions. With the price of equipment rising steadily, he was able to sell it two or three years after purchase at the same price which he paid for it. On some of the machinery he even turned a profit.

Among the pieces that were helpful in the construction of Thunder Hill, according to Slagle, was the Miller disc, not normally used in golf course construction. The disc is used in heavy farm conditions to eliminate plowing, as in the case of corn stubbles. He used the disc to correct a problem caused by a previous owner of the land. To discourage hunters, a farmer had plowed erratic furrows, which developed into deep ruts through erosion. They were almost impossible to walk across. Slagle saved a step in construction with the disc, as the other alternative was to plow and disc.

Other earth movers Slagle used included two John Deere self-loading pans, which he said were ideal for golf courses because of their high speed. He mentioned the Case 1150B bulldozer was highly auto-

matic, very fast and had an efficient angle and till blade. "Its speed is incredible," he said, "it can shape greens, traps and bunkers into a finished grade."

On the fairways he used a York rake with a drag of his own design. The drag was a pipe float that consisted of six four-inch pipes, ranging in length from 10 to 16 feet. The pipes were welded together with three-foot chains, the shortest pipe first and each succeeding pipe about a foot longer. Slagle felt existing drags, such as railroad ties, were not effective enough for this particular job, so he came up with the pipe float to accommodate the needs of golf course construction.

Thunder Hill's fairways, an eight-way mixture of bluegrasses, and the greens, Penncross bentgrass, were double and triple seeded. Slagle said the Brillion seeder had much to do with his success because it covers such a large area. The course was ready to seed last September, but rain delayed seeding until October. It had been mowed four times by the middle of November and Slagle played golf on it November 30. When the course officially opened in May, professionals and members of other clubs were almost astounded at the rapidity of turf growth. They commented that Thunder Hill has better turf than courses seeded years ago.

Why has Thunder Hill been such a success? According to Slagle, "Other golf course architects probably wouldn't have the success we've had because of the extra time and expense we've put in. But when you're doing it for yourself, you tend to do it right."



# PBI Gordon offers full line

The August issue of WEEDS TREES & TURF contained a turf herbicide report of currently mar-



keted herbicides from various chemical companies. The P.B.I. Gordon Corp., Kansas City, Kans., presented here was not included. WEEDS TREES & TURF regrets the omission.

P.B.I. Gordon Corp. offers a full line of pesticides under the Acme label and specializes in phenoxy herbicides. Its Trimec, with basic components of 2,4-D, MCPP and dicamba herbicides, can handle weeds on such sensitive grasses as bentgrass. Trimec broadleaf herbicide contains 27.59 percent DMA salt of 2,4-D, 13.86 percent DMA salt of mecoprop and 2.76 percent DMA salt of dicamba. It works best on 2,4-D tolerant grasses such as bluegrass but can function on closely mowed bentgrasses if applied in a reduced rate. A special P.B.I. Gordon bentgrass formulation is recommended.

Trimec herbicide can control sheep sorrel, knotweed, spotted spurge, chickweed, oxalis and henbit plus broadleaf weeds bedstraw, black medic, buckhorn, burdock, chicory, chickweed, clover, dandelion, dock, ground ivy, heal-all, henbit, lambsquarter, lespedeza, mallow, morning glory, peppergrass, pigweed, plantains, poison ivy, poison oak, purslane, ragweed, shepherd's purse, speedwell, spurge, wild carrot, wild garlic, wild lettuce, wild onion and yarrow.

Mecoprop (MCPP or CMPP) works best in broadleaf weed control on grasses. It contains 6.59 percent DMA salt of 2,4-D, 19.87 percent DMA salt of mecoprop and 2.63 percent DMA salt of dicamba. Bentgrass should not be overdosed.

Specific broadleaves MCPP can control are sheep sorrel, knotweed, spotted spurge, chickweed, oxalis, henbit, bedstraw, black medic, buckhorn, burdock, chicory, chickweed, clover, dandelion, dock, ground ivy, heal-all, henbit, knotweed, lambsquarter, lespedeza, mallow, morning glory, peppergrass, pigweed, plantains, poison ivy, poison oak, purslane, ragweed, sheep sorrel, shepherd's purse. speedwell, spurge, wild carrot, wild garlic, wild lettuce, wild onion and yarrow.

Trimec spray should not be used on centipede or St. Augustine grass without some expected injury and weeds should only be spot sprayed. Clover will suffer if sprayed.

Gordon's Amine 2,4-D turf herbicide is accepted for use on such 2,4-D weeds as annual sow thistle, annual thistle, bindweed, buckhorn, bull thistle. carpet weed, chicory, dandelion, knotweed, kochia, lambsquarters, pigweed, ragweed, wild lettuce, wild radish and vervain.

Gordon's Betamec-4 uses betasan based pre-emergence herbicide for control of annual bluegrass, barnyardgrass, deadnettle, fall panicum, foxtails, goosegrass, hairy crabgrass, lambsquarters, redroot, pigweed, shepherd's purse, and smooth crabgrass.

It should only be applied on well established grass lawns of such grasses as Bermudagrass, bahia, bentgrass spp, perennial bluegrass spp., centipede, fescue spp., Pensacola bahia, perennial ryegrass, poa trivialis, St. Augustine, red top and zoysia. Betamec-4 may be applied to dichondra lawns at seeding time or later.

The company suggests lawns not be reseeded within four months of application. The area should be renovated for reseeding by raking thoroughly to scarify the soil surfact. When possible and practical, peat should be mixed with soil for an optimum seed bed.

If turf diseases or physiological disorders makes reseeding necessary before four months after application, activated charcoal should be applied before reseeding to deactivate the chemical. Charcoal application should follow seven pounds per 1,000 sq. ft. (300 lbs. per acre in 600 gal. of water per acre). Irrigation should follow appliaction with no reseeding done until seven days after applying the charcoal.
