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INTRODUCTION

This Checklist identifies major resources available in microform in the Michigan State University Libraries and, through MSU, from the Center for Research Libraries in Chicago. It is not intended as a substitute for the Libraries' Author-Title Catalogs nor as a definitive list of Center microform holdings; rather it should be viewed as an alerting service for sizeable microform collections of which the faculty and students might not be aware.

When we first published this list, it contained 575 entries for microform sets acquired through June 1978. This second edition includes major microform acquisitions through June 1982 and contains 786 sets entries. Many of the entries are new, obviously. Some of the old have been updated. Pamphlets and Leaflets of the British Conservative and Unionist Party, for example, was greatly expanded by the purchase of fiche bringing the collection up to 1914. In some cases, the microform set itself has changed. The Archives of British Publishers, available at CRL, has become the Archives of British and American Publishers with the inclusion of the records of Harper and Brothers. In some cases, we have changed our entries to make the material more accessible. English Cartoons and Satirical Prints seems a more useful title than British Musuem. Department of Prints and Drawings, since both lead to the same microform set. Lastly, at least one set turned out to be a ghost: British Birth Control Materials was not purchased by CRL as we thought in 1978 and is no longer included.

All the original reasons for compiling this list are still valid. Much of the recent growth of the MSU Libraries has been in the area of major collections in microform. Many of these are primary collections available in the past only through extensive travel and at considerable private expense. Secondly, it is in their nature that a large part of any microform collection remains hidden from even the most resourceful patron. Although a single book

or journal in microform may be fully cataloged and easily accessible, microform series, large sets, and subject collections usually are not. They can not be browsed and often are not indexed. They may appear in the Author-Title Catalog, as does Constitutions and Laws of the American Indians, but even then may elude the user because he/she does not know the title given to the collection by the micropublisher. It also happens that cataloging itself may obscure what the reader wants to find. Slave Trade, an extensive and nearly unique research collection of over 1,200 reels of microfilm is hidden behind the main entry Great Britain. Foreign Office. General Correspondence before 1906.

This browsing list includes only microforms the contents of which, for one reason or another, are obscured and which, for that reason, might prove a bibliographic problem for the patron, such as

subject collections, series, and sets.

Instead of including long runs of newspapers with the major microform sets, as we did in the first edition, we have added a separate list of all microform newspapers, long and short runs, held by MSU. We did this for two reasons. Our microform newspapers are a valuable and growing resource which deserves to be better known and used. Secondly, readers often misinterpreted the inclusion of some newspapers but not others, assuming those listed to be all that we have.

This list does not include, however, monographic titles for which cataloging provides accessibility, dissertations, journals, or, in most cases, microforms which duplicate or supplement paper holdings.

We have also included, since they comprise valuable microform collections available at or through MSU, the holdings of the

MSU Archives and Historical Collections

and subject collections, series, and sets, but excluding newspapers, from

The Center for Research Libraries.

The Center for Research Libraries is a non-profit, cooperative library organization located in Chicago and maintained by its members for the purpose of

increasing the materials available to each. Founded in 1949 by ten mid-western universities, one of which was MSU, the Center is now an international organization with over 184 members and more than three million volumes.

The use of Center materials, which are available through the interlibrary loan office to all members of the academic community including undergraduates, greatly enlarges the resources open to the MSU patron. Its newspapers on microform, for example, which are not included in this list, are very extensive. Two sources are available in the MSU Library for detailed information about Center holdings. The majority of its newspapers are listed in their Catalog of Newspapers, and Center holdings in general, film and paper, are described in their Handbook. Both of these guides are available in the Reference section at MSU.

The development of microform materials in recent years has included new packaging techniques, such as a text-fiche combination, in which the illustrative material for the text is on microfiche. The Library has purchased seven of these text-fiche titles, and although they do not classify as major microform holdings, they do represent a different approach to microform publication which deserves observation. The Library holds the following titles:

Birth of a Nation: a formal shot-by-shot analysis.

Book Prospectuses before 1801 in the John Johnson Collection.

The 1905-07 Breasted Expeditions to Egypt and the Sudan: a photographic survey.

Documentary History of the Ratification of the Constitution.

Victorian Bookbinding: a pictorial survey.

Province in Rebellion: a documentary history of the founding of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, 1774-1775.

Masterpieces of Medieval Painting: the art of illumination.

Three final points need mentioning. Although most of the entries in the list are either by author or title, a few subject entries, such as Underground

Press, have been used to emphasize what otherwise be an obscure author or title listing. The MSU microform collection is located on the third floor of the west wing. Exceptions to this general location have been noted in parentheses. We have expanded the index to provide greater access to the microform sets, and it now includes primary as well as secondary subject material. The numbers in the index now refer to the numbered microform titles and are not page references, which should make finding an entry somewhat easier.
