**Brief Reviews Of Outstanding New Films**

Andy has his trembles in The Courtship of Andy Hardy but so does Judge Hardy and for a change Andy comes to his rescue (MGM)



If General Andrew Jackson really could come back to life he'd find stranger things to gape over than Ellen Drew's lipstick which fascinates him in The Remarkable Andrew (Para.)

COURTSHIP OF ANDY HARDY, THE For once Andy (Mickey Rooney) isn't doing the courting but Donna Reed is, which makes Andy's blindness seem pretty dumb—she's a beautiful newcom. er, in case you don't know. Donna is supposed to be a "droop" who has never had a good time and Andy, at Judge Hardy's request, does his good deed by taking her to a dance. But Donna soon turns out to be Cinderella in a pompadour and passes Andy by for the boy who liked her all along. There's a lot about Andy's job and family experiences and some sound advice from Judge Hardy on the silliness of drinking. (MGM)

INVADERS. THE Six German sailors are landed at a far north Canadian settlement by a submarine, which is sunk soon after leaving the men to fight their way across sparsely settled country to the Canadian Rockies. What would you do if you encountered a fleeing enemy? This is answered by a number of characters in vivid scenes, each played by a famous actor, such as Laurence Olivier, Leslie Howard, Raymond Massey, Anton Walbrook. Not only does the series of escapes keep you in suspense, but you'll learn the answer to something you may have been wondering about—that the humane ideals of democracy are stronger in the end than the brutal methods of the Nazis. This is a stirring film. (Col.)

MISTER V Robin Hood has a rival for popularity with boys and girls in the tales of modern adventurers who rescue men and women from the Nazis at the risk of their own lives. This film is a grand example with its mild proiessor hero (played by Leslie Howard) who manages to whish prisoners out of concentration camps right under the blinking eyes of Gestapo officers. There's a lot of fun in the film and no scenes of torture—thrills without chills. which is all right with us. (U.A.)

When Freddle Mercer's father and mother invite Hugh Alyesworth, an English boy (Roddy McDowall) to live with them during the War everybody, including Freddie's dog, falls for Hugh's charm. Freddie's girl, his gang, even his parents seem to forget he exists and he has a pretty unhappy time until he discovers that Hugh is a real brother and a lot of help at beating the neighborhood bullies at their own game. REMARKABLE ANDREW, THE
What if you got in a jam and three
former presidents of the United
States came to your rescue? Pretty thrilling, especially if they
were the ghosts of Andrew Jackson, George Washington and
Thomas Jefferson! This is what
happened to bookkeeper Andrew
Long (William Holden) when he
had the courage to stand up to
dishonest politicians who wanted
him to make false entries in his
books. Of course, no one but Andrew and you and I can see these
spry ghosts so the townspeople
think Andrew has gone loco when
he walks along the street talking
earnestly with General Jackson.

The good advice these famous patriots give Andrew applies to all of us today, so listen closely to what they have to say. Of course there's a story too, with pretty Ellen Drew as the girl who stands by Andrew. (Para.)

RIDE 'EM, COWBOY You may have seen this Abbott and Costello picture, but go see it again at your neighborhood theater. Because you'll not only laugh harder but see a few things you overlooked for laughing first time. The balmy but beautiful automobile ride to the bottom of the pond, for instance, where Costello judiciously fills a cup of water and takes a drink. And the Indian chase, when Abbott and Costello decide to switch sides because they're tired of being followed. And then there's Dick Foran's he-man voice—to say nothing of Dick Foran. Yes, Abbott and Costello and a yippee rodeo, too. (Univ.)
