Otherwise the story of an overworked child prodigy who runs away from her grasping ount and gets herself adopted by a small town couple in order to enjoy home life and school companionship is interesting. bomber after bailing out over Holland are so well told the film appears to be every bit true. The work of loyal Dutch in aiding R. A. 
