THE BEAM HUM IS LOUDEST IN CENTER. WHEN IT SOFTENS, AND THE "N" OR "A" IS HEARD, PLANE IS SLIPPING LEFT OR RIGHT.

CONE OF SILENCE THE AREA OVER A FLYING FIELD WHERE NO BEAM SOUND IS HEARD




WHEN AIRPLANE IS FLYING ON THE BEAM AND PILOT KNOWS HE IS NEARING THE AIRFIELD, HE WAITS FOR THE "CONE OF SILENCE" WHERE THE BEAM HUM FIRST INCREASES IN VOLUME, THEN FADES COMPLETELY. THIS MARKS THE OUTSIDE EDGE OF THE FLYING FIELD, AND SIGNALS PILOT THAT HE MAY GLIDE IN FOR A LANDING.


IN THICK, OVERCAST WEATHER, WHEN THE FIELD IS NOT VISIBLE, THE PILOT, UPON REACHING THE CONE OF SILENCE, MAY MAKE A BLIND LANDING BY CAREFUL TIMING AND USE OF HIS BLIND FLYING INSTRUMENTS.


MARKER BEACONS SPACED ALONG RADIO BEAM TELL DISTANCE TO AIRFIELD




WHILE FLYING ALONG THE BEAM, A PILOT MAY "SWITCH ON" FOR "MARKER BEACON" SIGNALS. THESE SIGNALS COME FROM SMALL RADIO TOWERS SPACED ALONG THE "BEAM WAY", WHICH SEND UP A LOUD KEY SIGNAL, EACH ONE A DIFFERENT NUMBER. THESE SIGNALS BREAK IN ON THE HUM OF THE BEAM, AND BY CHECKING ON THE FLYING MAP, THE PILOT MAY SEE HOW FAR AWAY THE AIRDROME IS.



AFTER THE PILOT HAS HEARD ONE OF THE MARKER BEACON SIGNALS AND LOCATED IT ON THE MAP, HE MAY SWITCH TO "VISUAL" ON INSTRUMENT BOARD AND SIGNALS WILL NOT BE HEARD. INSTEAD, A SMALL PANEL OPENS READING "MARKER BEACON" WHEN PLANE IS DIRECTLY OVER BEACON. THIS AVOIDS "JAMMING" THE BEAM HUM, WHICH AT TIMES IS DIFFICULT TO HEAR.






















TWE MOVIE GUIDE

BELLS OF CAPISTRANO—With
Gene Autry off to the Army Air
Force you won't want to miss his
final display of superb horsemanship in this film which has
a rodeo background. Gene's

FLYING FORTRESS—This film has a wonderful climax when a flight of bombers blitz Berlin. You'll like, too, the thrilling scene when Richard Greene crawls out on the wing of his bomber to put out a fire. (Warner)

FOR ME AND MY GAL—There were grand songs composed during World War I and the whole nation sang them, not only in the camps but at community "sings," as they were called. This Judy Garland musical brings these songs back and with them a story of a girl's rise to vaudeville stardom and the two men who rose with her, one through helping her, the other by using her to realize his own ambition. They all get to France as entertainers and there the film interestingly re-creates the atmosphere of World War I. (MGM)

GEORGE WASHINGTON SLEPT HERE—Jack Benny has a most uncomfortable time when his wife (Ann Sheridan) buys a 200-year-old country house which is about to fall down. They spend a whole summer fixing it up and then almost lose it to a grasping neighbor. Of course it's the gags that make the picture with Jack falling through holes in the floor, the ought-to-bespanked nephew, optimistic Uncle Stanley and the hired man who comes in every few minutes with more bad news about the stock, the lack of water and other things which make huge dents in Jack's purse. There they use Hitler's "divide and conquer" methods to set the Arabs at each other's throats so Dorothy can escape. You won't find a funnier film. (Para.)

SHADOWS ON THE SAGE—The Three Mesquiteers with Bob Steele heading the troupe in a story of a sheriff and a desperado who look enough alike to be taken for each other. (Rep.)

SHERLOCK HOLMES FIGHTS BACK—As if the War weren't enough to engage his deductive powers, up pops Holmes' old enemy Dr. Moriarity in this film to threaten the great detective's life and challenge his skill. Basil Rathbone as Holmes and Nigel Bruce as Dr. Watson are about perfect. (Univ.)
