

ANDY HARDY STEPS OUT—
The film tells of Andy's adventures just before leaving for college, and of course they include a new femme, as Andy-Mickey Rooney would say. Polly Benedict helps him out of this jam, but on the train he meets another lovely bound for the same college. Paul's English friend (Robert Coote of the R.C.A.F.), a Commando captain, heads the raid which follows in which both men are killed while rescuing the imprisoned villagers. Lt. Commander John

Farrow directed this powerful war film. (Col.)

IN WHICH WE SERVE—The story of a British ship from the day she is commissioned to her disappearance beneath the waters of the Mediterranean after being bombed in the battle of Crete. As she goes down a handful of survivors, clinging to a rubber raft, cheer her. And into the mind of each come treasured scenes of their lives on the ship and during leaves at home. These make a moving and inspiring story (U.A.)

JACARE—Most of us enjoy a good wild animal film, especially when Frank Buck talks while the picture is being shown. This one takes us to a new locale, the Amazon River Valley, where ferocious alligators, called Jacaré, grow to twenty feet! (U.A.)


