They are loaded with food, clothing, guns and hombs for American soldiers and airmen. Some of

those bombs some day may be dropped directly on Tokyo-You can see for yourself how this would be possible if you will look at a map of North America and notice how the Aleutian Islands run out from Alaska like a long finger pointing straight at Asia. Before this road was built the only route to Alaska was by sea, a trip that took many days, or weeks, through waters infested by Japanese subs.

The name of the new highway is the Alcan, formed by uniting the first syllables of the two words. Alaska and Canada. . in the next Sometimes in Canada it also

is called the Canalaska.. It might appropriately even be called the "I Can Highway."

For the Alcan is a road which many people thought never could be built. Even some engineers said that if it could be built at all it would take many years.

The problem was put up to Uncle Sam. He said, "I can!"

The road runs 1,600 miles from Dawson City, near Edmonton. Alberta, to Fairbanks, Alaska, over swamps and bogs, over and around mountains, through a wilderness, across rivers never explored before Yet it was open for traffic within seven months of the start of construction. The impossible

It was done by American soldiers and American and Canadian workmen who toiled night and day. seventy hours a week. Around the rude barracks In which they lived, there were no towns, no motion picture shows, no newspapers, no juke boxes. There was nothing but a vast, empty waste where men

glaring silently down, and millions of stars sparkling coldly overhead through the long winter nights. In the summer the workmen were beset by billions

of files and mosquitos; in the winter the tempera-ture fell to fifty degrees below zero. Sometimes the workers, while building bridges, had to Meer Lt. Gen. Jacob L. Devers stand waist deep for hours in icy waters. No soldiers ever had to endure greater hardships, overcome greater obstacles, or take greater risks.

Have you, too, a disagreeable and difficult job to do-one that will test your utmost courage and endurance? While you do it, think of these men who, given one of the most difficult engineering tasks of all time, still, dared to stand erect and says "I can!"

Brief Reviews of Outstanding New Films

AERIAL GUNNER—The Harlingen Army Gunnery School in Texas is the actual background for many of the scenes in this story of two recruits (Chester Morris, Richard Arlen) who have been personal rivals since school days but who become buddies when they see service together in the South Pacific. With the cooperation of the War Department the training sections of the film are authentic. (Para.)

CRASH DIVE—You like Tyrone Power and Dana Andrews so you know what to expect of the rugged Navy

officers they portray. But you probably don't know a great deal about service in a submarine and that is what this film shows you magnificently. Photographed in the most lifelike Technicolor we've ever seen, the underwater shots of submarines are unforgettable. Then there are two splendidly staged encounters with the enemy—one with a German Q boat flying a Swedish flag, with guns hid behind false sides of the ship. The other engagement is an all-out attack by a lone American sub on an enemy submarine base. Commandos get ashore to blow up installations while the subsfire boats in the harbor. (Fox)

FIVE GRAVES TO CAIRO—This is a thrilling tale of African warfare in the days when Rommel thought he was the Desert Fox. Eric von Stroheim plays Rommel to the life. You hear him boast to captured British officers that he'll be in Cairo by Sunday and then he shows them how he'll accomplish the feat. But you know something Rommel doesn't—Franchot Tone, a British corporal masquerading as a French waiter at German headquarters,

overhears the plan. Then it's hare and hounds until Tone gets back through the British lines with the information. The five graves are Rommel's secret which Tone discovers! (Para.)

PILOT NO. 5—That serving crooked politicians makes one an enemy of one's country is the timely and thoughtful theme of this excellent film. Franchot Tone is a young lawyer who accepts an appointment from an unscrupulous governor in order to get ahead financially.

and marry Marsha Hunt. The shady dealings this leads to finally convince him that he is sinning against democracy as much as if he were an out and out Fascist. He then tries to right some of the wrongs by turning state's evidence against the governor at the latter's impeachment trial. But even this doesn't make the community accept Tone as an honest man. Through the interest he inspires in a recruiting officer, Tone is finally accepted as an Air Force cadet. How he redeems himself in the eyes of his country makes a grand story. (MGM)

SPITFIRE—For centuries to come the Spitfire will be celebrated as the plane which turned back the Nazi air armada in the crucial Battle of Britain. Who designed this wonderful fighting plane? Perhaps few of us know. That is why this film, which tells the life story of R. G. Mitchell, designer of the Spitfire, is so important. Leslie Howard plays Mitchell, who dedicated his life to convincing England of the need to be ready to defend herself. The film is also a history of British aviation between wars. (RKO)

VICTORY THROUGH AIR POWER—Walt Disney, in his dramatic and novel treatment of Major Alexander P. de Seversky's book has, through the genius of his artists, brought us not only a complete history of aviation but a thrilling prophecy of future air power. But this isn't all—the film ends with a striking allegory in which an American Eagle, made up of thousands of planes, attacks and destroys an octopus, which is Japan, her tentacles fastened on Pacific outposts captured at the start of the War.
