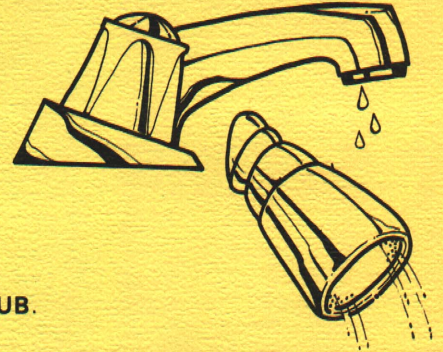
DO NOT STAND AND VISIT

AND STORM WINDOWS.



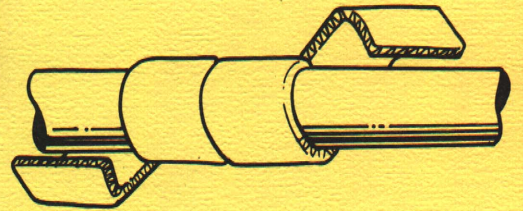
REDUCE SHOWER TIME OR

AMOUNT OF WATER IN BATHTUB.



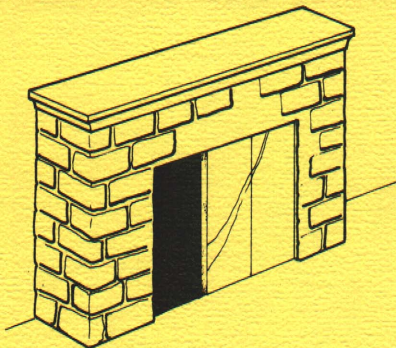
STOP DRIPPING HOT AND
COLD WATER FAUCETS.



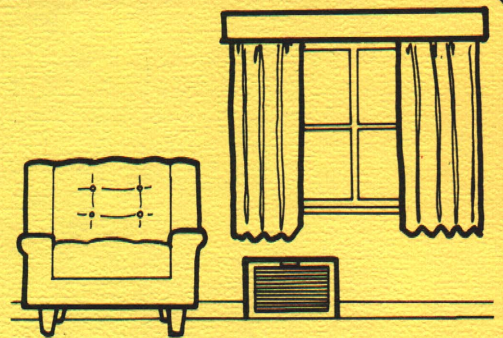
WRAP HOT WATER PIPES

2" BLANKET.



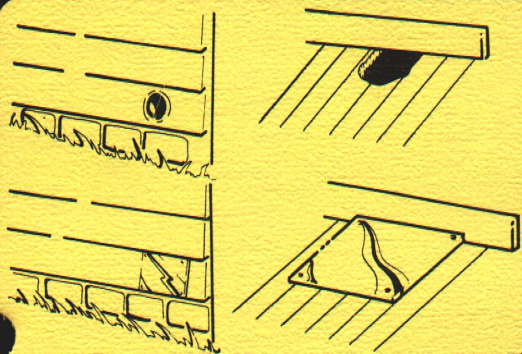
CLOSE FIREPLACE OPENING

PANELS.



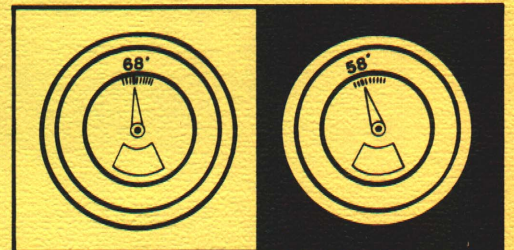
KEEP FURNITURE AND
