





REPLACE BROKEN GLASS IN INTERIOR WINDOWS AND STORM WINDOWS.






STOP DRIPPING HOT AND COLD WATER FAUCETS.




WRAP HOT WATER PIPES INSULATION STRIPS WITH 2" BLANKET.



CLOSE FIREPLACE OPENING WITH METAL OR INSULATED PANELS.




KEEP FURNITURE AND DRAPES AWAY FROM HOT AND COLD AIR REGISTERS.
