Pesticides must be registered with the U.S. Environment Protection Agency (EPA) and the Michigan Department of Agriculture before they can be used legally in Michigan. Purchase products that are labeled for the pest you wish to control and in the manner you wish to use them. Remember that the pesticide label is a legal document on pesticide use. Closely follow all instructions and limitations. The use of a pesticide in a manner not consistent with the product label can cause injury to crops, humans, animals and can lead to civil fines.
