"The day on which I lose my enthusiasm let me die." These were the words of Michigan State's greatest alumnus, spoken before nearly 4,000 farmers during Farmers' Week. Mr. Bailey is nearing his eightieth birthday. He gave one of the most forceful and effective speeches we have ever heard.

How many of us are disgusted with the whole creation after an unusually disappointing occurrence. We become disheartened and disinterested sometimes at slight cause. Some of us tire at study, at play, we become cynical, pessimistic and bored.

We doubt whether Liberty Hyde Bailey was ever bored or tired

we doubt whether Liberty flyde Balley was ever bored or tired with "things as they are" in his many years of great living. He looks back on his old college days here. He calls golden hours those which he spent reading Milton's "Lycidas" and other works. He rose from farmer boy to the greatest living writer of agricul-

tural books in the world.

He loved literature, reading and books, long before we had a liberal art division. He learned early to appreciate the poetry of living. Today he is as enthusiastic to learn as he was in his youth. He says he has "a sort of childish whim for the reincarnation theory". He wants to be an English teacher, and architect, and write a great book in future re-incarnations.




