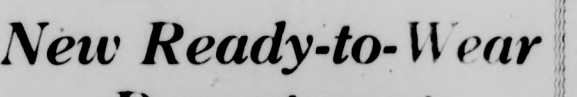

SPARTANS DEFEAT HOPE COLLEGE IN LAST FEW MINUTES OF PLAY

Score 14 Points in Remaining Eight Minutes of Play, Winning 21-36.

The Hope College basketball five went down to defeat there Monday evening at the hands of the Michigan State five 21-36 after holding an early lead over the Spartans. The State five played a rugged game during the first half and led 15-14 at the end of the half. With the score standing at 21-21 in their favor the Spartans showed the best form of the evening when they scored 14 points to the visitors zero in the remaining eight minutes of play.

Couch Benjamin VanAlstyne used eleven men in the game Monday evening, and spent much time in trying out different combinations. The starting line-up consisted of the men who played the larger part of the game at Notre Dame Saturday evening. Grove and Denfelder were at forwards, Felt at center, McGillivuddy and Schaub at guards.

Hope College drew the first blood when they scored on the first tip-off. A minute later the visitors brought the score to 4-0 in their favor by a long shot. In the meantime State showed the baskets with tries but could not score. After some clever passing however, Grove, the smallest man on the squad, dropped the ball through the hoop for the first Spartan tally of the evening. Hope retaliated with another basket and then Denfelder scored for State with a "long tom." The visitors came through with another basket after which State scored a field goal and making the score stand at 8-6 in Hope's favor. At this point Coach VanAlstyne made his first substitutions when he sent Dickson in for Grove, VanZylen for Denfelder, and Totten for Felt. Dickson then tied the score with a field goal. VanZylen's field goal put State into the lead for the first time in the evening but the lead was exchanged several times in the next few minutes of play. Dickson put State into the lead 15-16 as the half ended.

With the beginning of the last half Vanderhill was fouled by McGillivuddy and made good his try from the free throw line to tie the score. Grove, Denfelder, and Felt were sent back into the game. Hope then rallied and jumped into the lead 19-16 but State

quickly came back strong and a free throw by Sheathelm, a substitute for Grove, and a field goal to McGillivuddy tied the score. In 19 Sheathelm added another point to State's total by the free throw route and Felt caged a field goal. It was at this time when DeVelder scored the last points of the game for the visitors, a field goal.

With the score standing 22-21 in favor of State and with only eight minutes to go, Dickson and Colvin were sent into the fray in place of Sheathelm and McGillivuddy. Then Michigan State showed its greatest part of speed for the evening. In the eight minutes the Spartans by virtue of fast accurate passing and the good under the basket shooting of Dickson were able to score 14 points without allowing their opponents a single point.

In this final rally Dickson caged five field goals while Denfelder and Felt got one apiece. Russo was sent in to take Schaub's place for the last five minutes of play.
