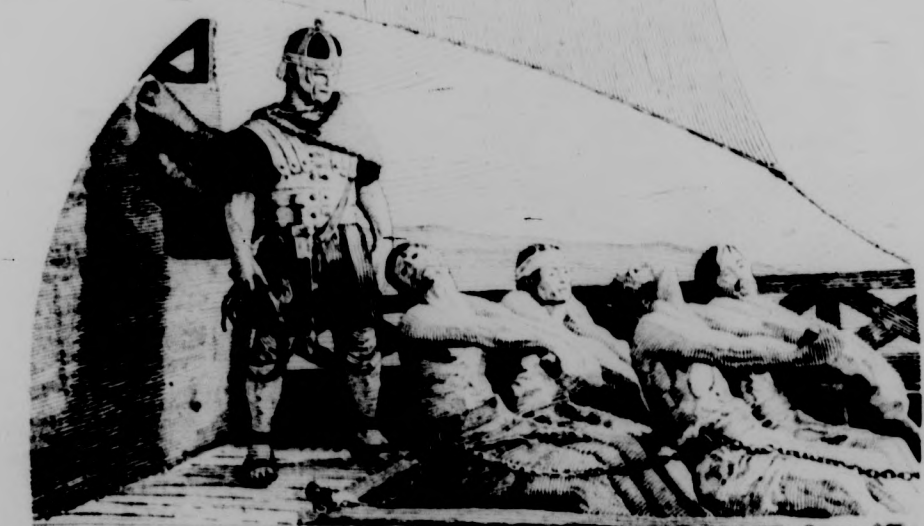

Central Intercollegiate Affair to Attract Athletes from Many Schools.

The Michigan State College track team will participate in their first away from home meet of the season when they compete in the Central Intercollegiate meet to be held in the Notre Dame field house on Saturday at South Bend, Indiana.

About twenty of the biggest universities and colleges of the middle west exclusive of the Big Ten schools have been invited to send teams and over 125 athletes will probably compete in the thirteen different events scheduled to be held.
