NEXT FALL'S DECORATIONS

The sight of American flags along Grand River Wednesday brought to mind the fact that next fall every Saturday when the football team plays at home, it will also be somewhat of a holiday and deserving of some decorations.

Since Grand River is the main street of the town, that is the place where signs of festivity should most properly be placed. It is from indications on that street that people passing through obtain their impression of the spirit of this college. Also it is a place where all students pass many times during the day.

The type of decorations to be adopted, we believe, should be green flags with the white Spartan "S," a form similarly employed in other college towns. They should be placed along the street in the same manner as

the American flags were Wednesday.

Some organization of the college, perhaps the student council is the proper body, should initiate plans at once for materialization of this feature. The banners can not be made on a moment's notice. Therefore, if this decoration is to become a reality, the council should take action before the end of the term.

The cost of the project should not be prohibitive. It is probable that merchants along the street would be glad to cooperate in this matter if the scheme were proposed to them by the council through such a group as the East Lansing Business Men's association.

Decorations of this type should aid immeasurably in adding to the football atmosphere of the town. Next fall with the new coaching staff headed by Harry Kipke in charge, there will undoubtedly be a great influx of alumni gridiron enthusiasts over the state to witness the season's successful draw a large audience out the fall.

With these conditions in mind to East Lansing, Michigan, be indications that the student body, as a whole, is full of football spirit. Flags will be of great help. The student council and business men's association should get together at once and make this preparation.
