SPARTANS DEFEAT WOLVERINES IN RELAY CARNIVAL FEATURE

Lauren Brown Again Breaks Varsity Record in 2-mile Run; McAtee Ties Carnival Record.

STATE WINS 5 RELAYS

The clinching of a victory over Michigan university in the special two-mile relay, Brown's breaking of the varsity record in the two mile run, and victories in all the other relays that the Michigan State varsity track men com-

peted in, were the features of the Spartans' good showing in the ninth annual Michigan State Relay carnival held in the State gymnasium Saturday evening.

Probably the most thrilling exhibition of the evening was State's victory over the University of Michigan two-mile relay quartet that was the last event on the long, interesting card of events. A Green and White team composed of Clark, Roosen, Willmarth and Hackney covered the distance in 8:41.8 to achieve a close defeat suffered a year ago in a similar race. The Spartans' final man, Hackney, beat his Wolverine rival to the tape by three yards.

Lauren Brown, dominant State distance runner who is making a nationwide name for himself in the longer runs, again furnished a thrill to the track fans when he shattered the all-time varsity two-mile record by shattering the record for 12 laps in 9:44.4. Brown thus broke his own record which he set last week in a dual meet with Marquette university. Chamberlin, a teammate, paced Brown until the last four laps when the Spartan star increased his pace to what you might

call a sprint which left his rivals far behind.

Harold McAtee, State's veteran pole vaulter, tied the carnival record of 12 feet 6 inches which he set last year. Dill, the only other Spartan to win a first place in the special events, tossed the shot 39 feet 8 inches to win that event.


