

VOTE ON FACULTY SUPERVISION

STATE GRANTS \$50,000 SUM FOR IMPROVEMENTS

Tax Provides \$1,640,284 for General Use.

FURTHER GRANTS MADE

Pay Spread Over Several Different Projects.

Act of the legislature recently and approved by Governor Fred W. Green, Michigan State college will have at its disposal \$500,000 for purposes of building and improvements and a further sum of \$1,640,284 for general use. The grant of the mill tax, which the legislature and for an additional \$200,000 which will be available in 1932 for use on a proposed new cultural building.

Of the grant of \$500,000, the money spread out over several different projects. Two hundred thousand will be in reserve as a start on the Agricultural building, while \$32,000 will be used for new farm lands, \$20,000 for a new beef cattle barn, \$8,000 for sheep, beef and cattle barn, \$12,000 for sheep barn, \$5,000 for an experimental sheep barn, \$35,000 for breeding sheep, \$5,000 for an apary, \$22,000 for a dairy herd, \$10,000 for a dairy herd, \$5,000 for an animal disease research laboratory, \$5,000 for a grain and hay barn, and \$130,000 appropriated for new equipment and improvements.

These figures are covering a two-year building program; the buildings will not be built until some time next year.

The mill tax is to cover general operating expenses of the college.

EDUCATION HEAD COMES AUGUST 15

E. L. Austin to Begin Duties After Finishing at Alabama Poly Tech.

Everett L. Austin, newly appointed head of the department of education, will come to East Lansing August 15 to take over his new duties. He plans to spend the summer vacation at the Alabama Polytechnic Institute, Auburn.

Dr. Austin is now dean of men at the Ball Teachers college, Muncie, Ind., and is well qualified for his work at Michigan State college. He received a B.A. degree from Moore's Hill college in 1917, his B.S. degree in 1918, his A.M. degree from Purdue university in 1923, and his Ph.D. degree from the University of Illinois in 1928.

Dr. Austin began his teaching experience in Ripley county rural schools, later becoming principal of the two schools at Moore's Hill. He next served as director of supervised teaching in the high school division of Moore's Hill. From there he went to Shiloh, Mo., where he taught in the high school for two and one-half years. He was then at the University of Illinois where he was associated with club leaders, once going to Washington to meet President Coolidge. He then spent the past two years in five New England states and in Rochester, N. Y., for the purpose of studying methods of education.

Dr. Austin is a member of the National Society for the Study of Education and is past president of the Phi Delta Kappa, national honorary educational fraternity.

Keith Byrne, who worked behind the plate at Oberlin on Wednesday in his first varsity competition, was again doing the catching duties Friday and turned in a good day's work besides collecting a single in the eighth to drive in the last Spartan score.

Ohio State made good its chances in the first frame to push two tallies across the plate. After Byrne passed the first batter, Hess rolled an easy one to Byrne who worked in his tracks to start a double play. McCauley muffed the hurler's throw on second and both men were safe. Fessler, Buckeye all-American football and initial soccer, grounded out to Byrne. Wildfield, Ohio receiver, drove a hard hit to deep left center for three bases to score his teammates.
