MICHIGAN STATE FRATERNITIES INITIATE OVER SIXTY PLEDGES IN PAST SPRING TERM "HELL WEEK"

Number of Initiates Shows Decrease From Those Taking Vows a Year Ago: Three-day Informal Programs Are Terminated on Friday and Saturday by Societies.

THIRTEEN fraternities initiated over sixty pledges during THIRTEEN fraternities initiated over sixty pledges during the past week. Most of the societies had only a few men to put through, four to five being the general average. There were two exceptions to this trend the Hermians having but one man to initiate while the Alpha Gamma Rhos were on the other end of the scale with eleven neophytes.

"Hell Week" officially started last Tuesday at 5 o'clock and terminated on Friday at the same hour, according to Integraternity rulings which state that initiation shall continue through only 72 hours of week days or school time. The actual ending of the initiatory procegrams was left to the individual fraternity's discretion, with the provisions that it last not longer than Sunday. Most of the societies wound up their informals Friday night or some time Saturday.

Although the number of initiates is less during the spring term than the winter term, the total of sixty this year is unusually small compared with 194 which was the total of the previous term this year.




