## SEVEN SPARTAN THINCLADS MAKE JOURNEY TO QUAKER CITY TO VIE WITH EAST'S BEST IN PENN RELAYS

Team to Compete in Three Events: Brown to Run in 3,000 Meter Steeple-Chase; Outlook is Bright for Ranking in Honors.

**S**EVERAL SPARTAN track men, accompanied by Coach Ralph H. Young, left East Lansing yesterday afternoon to participate in the 36th annual Pennsylvania Relay carnival to be held at Philadelphia today and Saturday. The men making the trip are Captain Lauren P. Brown, Clark S. Chamberlain, Lewis H. Hackney, Loring P. Fullerton, Edgar C. Ryan, David W. Swanson, and David A. Salmon.

The team will participate in three relays: a distance medley, a mile relay, and a four-mile relay. Besides this, Captain Brown will run in the open 3,000 meter steeple chase.

The first relay, the distance medley, will be held today at 4:05. Salmon will run the 110, Hackney the 880, Fullerton will cover the three-quarter mile stretch, and Chamberlain, running anchor, will take care of the mile. Brown is booked to run the 3,000 meter at 5:25.

Saturday at 4:35 Salmon, Ryan, Hackney, and Swanson will run in the class "B" mile relay, and 45 minutes later, at 5:20, either Hackney or Swanson will team up with Brown, Chamberlain, and Fullerton in the four-mile relay.
