

Spartans Defeat Marquette University in Meet Wednesday

STATE TRACKMEN UPSET DOPE TO NOSE OUT HILLTOPPERS 58 TO 50 FOR SECOND VICTORY

Chamberlain, Smith, Russell, Liberty, Yarger, Olsen Exceed Expectations By Turning in Exceptional Performances to Overcome Stiff Competition in Every Major Event.

WINNING SEVEN out of thirteen first places, and placing second in seven, Michigan State's track team scored its second consecutive dual meet victory of the season over Marquette university at the gymnasium Wednesday night. Rated as the under-dogs before the meet, the Spartans put on an excellent exhibition of running and leaping to nose out the Hilltoppers by the score of 58 to 50.

Clark Chamberlain once more led the Green and White athletes with a double win in the mile and two mile events. The long-legged Spartan star took both events in fair time, not extending himself in either race, although Jack Walter, a 1928 Olympic team member, was his opponent in the mile, and Emmett Roban, a two-miler who twice defeated Lester Brown last year, took his marks with him in the longer race.

Norman Smith, State's six sophomore high jumper, rose to new heights in his event when he cleared the narrow bar at 5 ft. 10 inches to break his own record, second established last week against Chicago. The meet predictions had favored Nelly Macgregor, who is reported to have cleared better than six feet this winter. It was performance like these where the Spartans exceeded the coach's expectations that gave State its winning margin.

Mike Chamberlain's hurdles race came through in fine style to take every possible point in the timber-landing event, since each took was allowed no more than two starts. The margin here was 11 points to two in State's favor of the edge. Bob Russell stepped the low hurdles in 51.4 seconds, a second slower than the victor, Fred Hill, but the other runner, Ted Smith, in the low hurdles, winning in 52.4, also went behind the victor.

Paul Olson contributed his usual few points by clearing 12 feet in the pole vault, with Jimmy Arbores and Moser three yards to third behind Sebastian Macgregor, who was second.
