## SPARTANS CONCEDED SLIGHT EDGE IN SEASON'S LAST GAME WITH POWERFUL DETROITERS

### Game Tomorrow Will Be Tenth Meeting of Two Schools on Gridiron; Michigan State Has Won Four Games and So Have Titans; Game Last Year Ended in Scoreless Tie.

Michigan State's rugged football team plays its last game of the season tomorrow afternoon when the Spartans invade Dinan field, Detroit, to do battle with the University of Detroit Titans. Unless Governor Wilber M. Brucker requests the Crowleymen to don their uniforms in a charity game the football equipment will be packed away until another spring rolls around.

Coach Jimmy Crowley's men will invade the Titan arena favorites to win their first victory over the Doraismen since '23, when the "Aggies" scored a 2-0 upset over a powerful "T" of D. eleven coached by "Germany" Schultz. On the basis of their battle last week in the Wolverine bowl at Ann Arbor the Spartans are conceded the odds to win the game.

The teams will be fighting this year for the retention of the Harold Smead trophy, a beautiful silver cup dedicated to State's captain of last year who was unable to lead his team due to an automobile accident during the summer. This official symbol of victory in the annual classic was instituted last year by the members of Xi Chapter of Alpha Epsilon Pi, national book fraternity.

Tomorrow's game will be the tenth encounter between grid teams of the two institutions. In the nine games played to date each school has won four victories, last year's encounter played in the Spartan stadium resulting in the only deadlock of the series. A crowd of over 20,000 grid fans is expected to set a new attendance record for the season at the Titan's home field.

Coach Crowley and his proteges have come to the realization that the Detroit game will be one of the toughest battles they have staged this year. If the Spartans emerge with a win it will be because they put everything into the game and the meeting tomorrow will be far from a walk-away for either grid team. The Titans have many stars from last year's team back this year and they will be glad to show their followers that they can better the scoreless tie that was recorded at East Lansing last year. The Spartans will run into plenty of trouble when they back up against such men as O'Neill, Parsons, Harkett, Merritt, Bee, Shimmer, Harkness, and Brock. Rocky Rasmussen, former Grand Haven star, was a great facility in last year's meeting of the two teams but so far this season he has shown outstanding form. He is a field general of no mean ability and it may be his toe that will decide the game.

Detroit Desperate

Detroit's record this season has not been all that it might have been. The first game of the season which was termed a practice session, backfired and the Titans lost to DePaul. Fordham trampled them underfoot two weeks ago when the Doraismen invaded the "Paw grounds." New York City in an attempt to halt Coach DeVanough's men, last Saturday the Titans expected to down a Villanova team handily but had to be contented with a scoreless tie. Coach Dorais and his men have made many caustic remarks about Spartan methods and ability this week and tomorrow afternoon will attempt to prove their self alleged superiority over the Crowleymen.

Perfect Defense

Monday and Tuesday this week were practically a vacation for the Spartan gridlers who were granted a chance to get some much needed rest. Intensive preparation for the Titan game did not start until Wednesday and actual scrimmage was not indulged in until last night. Coach Crowley wasn't much impressed with the showing his men made in practice Wednesday night and he was not showing telling signs they would have to show vast improvement if they were to come home with a win this weekend.
