## GITTA GRADOVA, ANNUAL MEMORIAL SERVICE IN ARMORY NEXT SUNDAY WILL HONOR STATE'S WAR HEROES

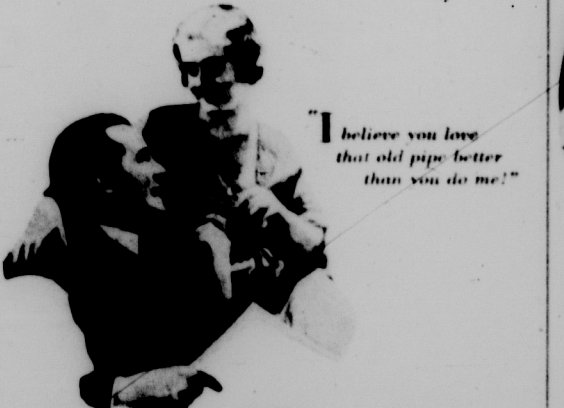
