Three prominent members of Michigan State's faculty, all of whom had served for long periods at this institution, were removed from office last week. The state board of agriculture, governing body of the college, last Friday night accepted the resignations of Joseph A. Cox, dean of agriculture, and James B. Hasselman, director of publications. It also abolished the office of college historian, held by Dr. Frank S. Kedzie, president emeritus and identified with the college for 52 years.

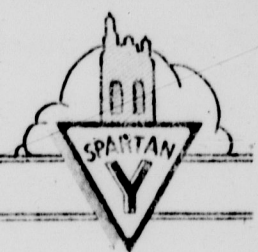

HARD WILL GIVE TALK IN LANSING

Internationalist to Speak on European Relations in Tower Hall Series.

William Hard, noted political analyst, journalist and author, will present the third of the Lansing Tower Hall lecture series tomorrow morning at 10:30 a. m. when he speaks on European conditions and the relation of the European problem to internationalism in America.

Hard has had a broad education having studied at Northwestern University, University College, London and the Philander Smith Settlement, and also residents of Hull House, Chicago.

As a member of the Geneva Disarmament Conference this year he came in contact with the political heads of the various European governments and consequently was able to see a first-hand view of the entire disarmament and debt situation. It will be his topic on which he will speak tomorrow.

His lectures are held in the Tower Hall, 1000 Michigan street, at 8:30 p. m. on Wednesdays. His previous lectures have been on "The League of Nations" and "The League of Nations."

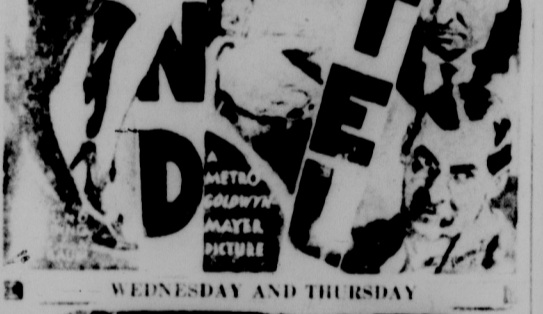

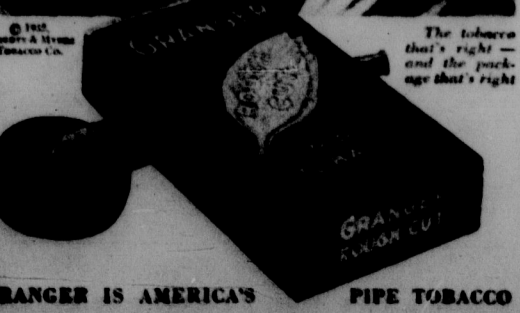
