INDUSTRY COMPETES WITH THE BRAIN TRUST

Dr. Moulton suggests, among other things, that diffusion of wealth is necessary; and that behind every unit of productive power there must be a corresponding unit of consuming power, if the economic system is to operate successfully house These are very timely statements, coming as they do six years after the beginning of the depression

When the depression started in earnest, shortly after the, stock market crash of 1929, there were several major devel- of drive opments which might have been observed by the casual layman as well as by the doctor of economics. One noticed that iten guys workers were laid off by their employers because a shortage of orders made it necessary to reduce costs of operation. The employer saved money, temporarily, by this step. But the idle workers, with no income to spend, brought about retrenchments on the part of merchants, which in turn affected other wage earners, and thus a vicious circle was under way.

To the casual observer it was inimediately apparent that a stagnation of wealth through concentration had reduced consuming power, which had reacted harmfully on brodue.

To the brilliant economist it represented something else Overlooking the fact that many people lacked the necessitieof life in food, clothing and mechanical equipment, he concluded that overproduction had glutted the market and stailed the economic system. Accordingle, the economist advocated a curb on the efficiency of our machine age, and proposed the destruction of wealth.

Then, for six years, the economists wondered didn't pall out of the depression. Theorists, who paid prodiffers to destroy the necessities of life and paid consumers to buy the necessities of life, were puzzled because the depres ion lingered

Now we are informed that our leaders realize what colleg freshmen were supposing four years ago. Instead of retro gressing by spending money to stagnate wealth we should spend money to diffuse it, even though we lose temporarily by this form of inflation. Seguer or later we must put a nor al cycle of production and consumption into motion

The fact that our economic dictators are aware problem is certainly a hepeful one
