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Florida U. Opens General College

Gainesville, Fla. — (ACP) — Freshmen at the University of Florida who are midway through their first term are subjects of a new experiment in higher education.

Approved purposes of the new undertaking are to offer an opportunity for general education and to provide the guidance needed by all students in order that the choice of professional work may be postponed until the student knows better his capacity and disposition to undertake work that will be profitable to himself and society.

To satisfy the needs of those who have only a limited time to give to college training and consequently should concern themselves with general viewpoint and major understandings, instead of introductions to special subject-matter fields which they may never enter and to provide for the constant adjustments required in higher general education incident to the changing conditions of modern life.

Subject matter of the various courses, and the methods of presentation are to be constantly varied in order to awaken the interest of the student, stimulate his intellectual curiosity, and cultivate the attitude necessary for enlightened citizenship.
