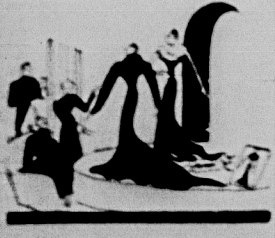

FLINT CONCERT DRAWS PRAISE

Three Local Music Students Appear in Genesee County City Last Saturday.

Last Saturday afternoon (evening) in Flint, Michigan, the students of the Michigan State college music department gave a concert before the St. Cecilia club of Flint. The students were accompanied to Flint by Michael Press, who had charge of the selecting of the program.
