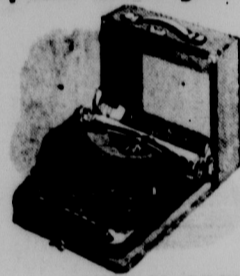

Second Half Rally Wins For State '5'

Spartans Travel East to Play Buffalo and Syracuse This Week-End

Victorious in their last two starts, the Spartan basketball team takes to the road this week, traveling east for games with the University of Buffalo and Syracuse.

Captain VanAlstyne named a squad of nine players to make the trip in hopes of extending the winning streak. State leaves its home court boasting a .750 average, having rolled up six wins against a pair of set-backs.

Of the two contests in the east the one with Syracuse is expected to be the toughest, although Buffalo is an unknown quantity. Usually teams about which little is known have a tendency to pull surprises.

Syracuse is reputed to have one of the smoothest working quintets in the east and a squad which possesses plenty of height as well as speed. Last year the Spartans upset the Orange from Syracuse in a "dogfight," 36 to 30. The Orangemen put on a furious rally in the late minutes to nearly catch the wily State men.

To beat the Hawaiian All-Stars Tuesday night in Demonstration hall, the Spartans came from behind at the start of the second half to score 37 points in the last period before winning, 55 to 31. VanAlstyne started his reserves to open the contest but after the Hawaiians had worked up a 16-10 lead, he rushed in the varsity who fared much better. When the half ended the midget-like Hawaiians were leading, 22 to 18.

But in the final half the Spartans started to move, and move they did. With the fast-improving front line clicking in great fashion, the Spartans chalked up 19 points before the All-Stars located the hoop.

From then on it was State in a breeze. But no one can say that those Hawaiians did not try. Ah Choo Goo and Takeo Goya swarmed all over the floor in efforts to overtake the Spartans but their lack of height handicapped them no little.

Too, their five starting players stayed in every minute and even at the close of the game seemed fresh and full of hustle. Gore Moroguchi paced the visitors with 9 points.

Marty Hutt, State forward, captured high point honors with six field goals of twelve points. The State defense worked well in the last half with Howard Kraft and Leo Callahan standing out.

The nine men named to make the eastern trip are Frank Shidler, Marty Hutt, George Falkowski, Leo Callahan, Howard Kraft, Max Dalrymple, Bill Carpenter, Charles Henry, and Ben Dargush.

Falkowski Tops Spartan Scorers With 91 Points

With 91 points in seven games, George Falkowski, forward, tops the Michigan State basketball scorers to date this season. Falkowski has clicked on 36 field goals and 19 free throws.

Marty Hutt and Frank Shidler, the other members of State's crack sophomore front line, are in second and third places, respectively. Hutt has counted 32 baskets and seven free throws for 71 points, while Shidler has scored 29 goals and six charity tosses for 64 points.

Fourth place is held by Leo Callahan with 53 points, 12 more than his running mate, Howdy Kraft. Ben Dargush has fired in 21 points.

State Wrestlers Open Season at Wheaton

Although rattled to some extent by injuries, Michigan State's wrestling team will leave tomorrow for Wheaton, Ill. where the Spartans will open their 1938 season Saturday meeting Wheaton college. The State grapplers face Michigan in a second meet next Monday.

Frosh Mermen Face Varsity

The freshman swimming team is scheduled to meet the varsity next Wednesday at 5 p. m. in the college pool. The spectators will be limited to men students.

A good meet is in prospect, for the frosh have several performers who look to be fine swimmers. Among these are Ladd, Lusk, Siamowski, and Cooper, free style; and Owen in the breast stroke. The varsity time trials were held earlier in the week to enable Coach Jake Daubert to get a line on the ability of his squad. Bell is completely recovered from a strained leg ligament which he suffered last spring and he will be ready to go against Michigan on the 26th.

Short Term Five Defeats Adrian

Michigan State's short course basketball team ran up its second straight victory Tuesday, turning back the Olivet freshman five, 28 to 25, in the gym. With six baskets for 12 points, Krimmel led the way for the State victory.

The short couriers will be out to score their third triumph tonight when they play Barrack in the old gym at 6:30 o'clock.
