Is There a Place for Them?

For several years graduates of the Michigan School for the Blind have attend ed Michigan State. Scholastically they have been successful, but socially their affiliations have been disappointing.

It would be extremely difficult and unfair to say that any one person, club, organ-

ization or even they, themselves, are singly to blame for the social failure of this group of students, but all causes combine to bring about an unfortunate situation. Because these collegians are handicapped as far as sight is concerned they are more or less loomed to become the "wall flowers" of M. S. C.'s social events.

Of the nine School for the Blind graduates attending State this term only two are totally blind. The remaining seven have enough sight to enable them to be socially independent. Six of these seven partially sighted students are good dancers, while two of the remaining three are accomplished musicians. Their etiquett and social training is above the average.

This group of plucky students is not idly sitting by hoping you will become social godmothers. They have enrolled and have been taking an active part in several college activities including the college chorus. Station WKAR, the Home Economics club, and the State News.

The unfortunate circumstances in which the partially-sighted or blind student finds himself results unquestionably in a greater portion of his social troubles. This of course, can not be helped. He realizes that his handicap tends to hold friends from him whom ordinarily he would have no trouble in acquiring. He also realizes that your false, but sincere, conception of him is that of a studious, lifeless, timid and unfortunate human being. So that a wrong impression may not be left with you may this one point be emphasized. Although he feels that your opinion of him is one of pity and sorrow, he does not wish that pity. He appreciates your helpfulness, your interest shown in him, and your welcoming class attitude .- H. S.






