#### Why Not Smooth In Privacy?

Disgusting in the extreme to most selfrespecting students is the current wave of "smoocheria" that has infested the Union lounge of late.

Designed primarily to provide a recreational and communal center, the Union is rapidly becoming little more than a petting parlor comparable in intent, but not in privacy, with the old-fashioned courting parlor which was the inevitable adjunct to every home containing an eligible daughter.

College students are supposed to possess at least a modicum of refinement and good taste. The Lounge Lotharios and Mushy Marys seem to be doing their amorous ut most to pervert such a concept and to taint the public's opinion of students in general with their moonstruck mawkishness. A few inconsiderate couples can do immeas urable injury to the student body politic.

"Smooching" is not a nice word, but it an apt one. It connotes the cheapness and commonness of the act. When indulged in conspicuously, "smoothing" is an offense against good breeding and a humiliating annovance to all who are unfortunate enough to have to witness it.

To pass through the Union lounge and observe the place littered with boorish couples sprawled in shapeless and some-. times actually indecent messes is disconcerting if not downright embarrassing. This is especially true when, as in spring term, relatives and friends come to visit the campus. If the present ludricous situa tion persists, it is not unreasonable to as sume that students will steer visitors away from the Union as though it were a pes house. Such a condition would, of course vitiate the purpose of the building.
