Michigan State's baseball team suffered its third straight setback and its sixth loss of the season Thursday when the powerful University of California nine handed the Spartans a 6-2 setback. In fairness to California it must be said that the score does not represent the difference between the two teams. The Golden Bears had too much class for the Spartans and' but for several breaks might well have won more easily. This is to be expected of a team which comes from a state where baseball is played the year around. The Bears played 30 games in their regular schedule and are now on a post-season swing throughout the country. They have won eight straight games since leaving home.

In Thursday's game California lost no time in showing that they meant business by scoring four runs in the first inning off Glen Rankin, who started for State. The Bears counted twice more in the sixth. The Spartans bunched two of the three hits they made of Piper, Bear hurler, in the eighth, to score their two runs. After two men were out Scott was safe on Duezbo's hobble and legged it home on Art Libbers' long double to right. George Owen then hit a single to left, scoring Libbers. The Spartans went hitless until the sixth inning when Ray Dahlstrom, a pinch batter, beat out a slow roller toward first.
