## ABBOT HALL TO BE SAVED

### Board Selects Site for New Auditorium

Abbot Hall safe; Hospital will be Memorial to Olin

That was assured yesterday when the State Board of Agriculture decided to have the auditorium east of Farm lane, just north of the site of the Water Carnival grounds.

In a meeting centered on building it was also decided to name the new hospital Olin Memorial Health center, according to John A. Hannan, secretary.

Locations for the new women's dormitory and the field house were also made official. The women's dormitory will be built west of the Union building behind the Music center and near East Mary Mayo hall.

Site of the \$500,000 Field house and Gymnasium will be across the river, east of Demonstration hall and south of the baseball field.

Work on the Veterinary plant will begin Monday. It is estimated by Dr. G. G. Grier, Construction Commissioner, which was granted the bid at the meeting. The price accepted was \$125,000, without the wing which was originally planned.

Gifts accepted by the Board included a 4,000 volume collection of geological books. They consist of the entire collection of Dr. R. A. Smith, late professor. A \$500 gift from the Michigan Best Book Association, Saginaw, was also accepted for work in the botany department.

Bill, the excavation of the women's dormitory will be let Monday. Hannan said after the meeting. Work will begin Wednesday.

Estimated \$400,000 for a \$32,000 PWA grant for the Field House and Gymnasium was made.

Personal charges approved at the meeting include the appointment of Dr. C. V. Millard as assistant professor of education.

## Spartans to Renew Grid Rivalry With Syracuse Eleven

Orange to Stake Undeveloped Record in Macklin Field Today; Wide-open Game in Prospect With Passes Expected to Fill Air; 20,000 to Attend

A rivalry buried for four years will be unpacked from moth balls today when Michigan State's Spartans battle the Orange of Syracuse in Macklin field at 2 p. m.

And from all indications today's contest will be as much a thriller as each of the four previous games engaged in by the two schools on the football field.

The game is expected to develop enough football pyrotechnics to dazzle the crowd, which will number more than 20,000. There'll be speed games, spectacular passing and plenty of high power meeting head on across the green turf of Macklin field.

Syracuse rolled into East Lansing last night undefeated in three games and rated among the best 10 teams in the nation to date. The Orange are in high gear—and their eyes are focused on one of the several New Year's day bowl games.

They were in the same position when they last visited the State campus in 1933, undefeated and untied. The clean date was a thing of the past after Syracuse limped from the field, whipped thoroughly by the Spartans, 27-0, in a Driller.

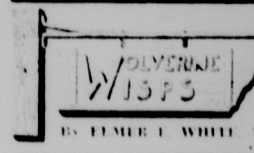

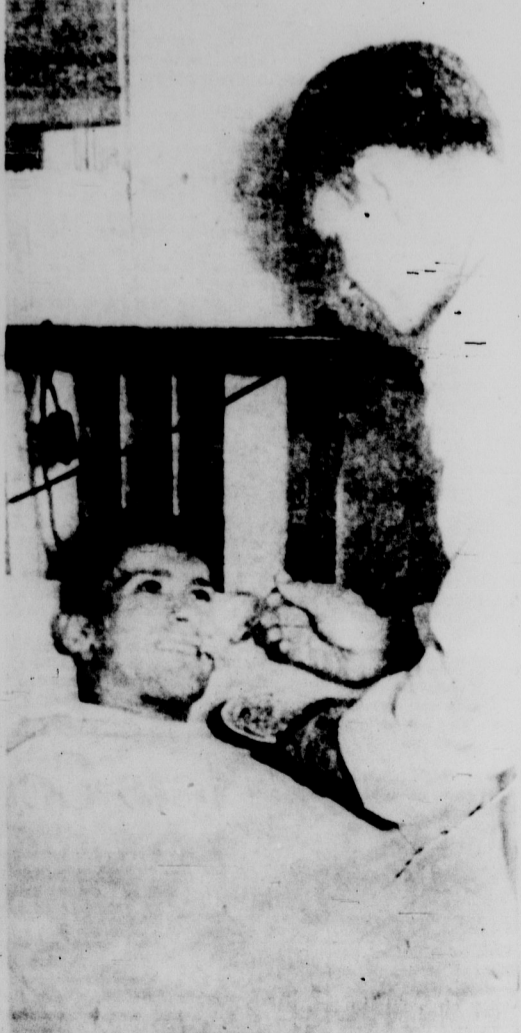

Because of a misunderstanding with the telephone operator, the call was sent to the Lansing fire department rather than that of East Lansing. As a result the apparatus was sent to 1291 Albert street in Lansing.  
When the fire department did not respond, Mrs. Ferris repeated the call and was given the East Lansing department. When they arrived, they found that the curtain and the bedding was a blaze. It required only the small chemical tank to extinguish it.  
When questioned about the matter, Fire Chief Criss warned that residents of East Lansing should make sure that their emergency calls are placed with the East Lansing fire department, in order that there be no confusion in answering them.

### Lansing Civic Players' Guild Scores Smash Hit in 'Stage Door' Opening

Playing before a capacity audience of 1,200, "Stage Door," the Lansing Civic Players' Guild season opener for the 1938 season started rather slowly, faltered, then gathered momentum to a climactic, stirring finish.  
Mig. Ruth Bering, in the role of Terry Randall, was by far the outstanding actress of the play. Naturally cast, she did the intense, powerful characterization perfectly. Her own vivid personality, as seen through the screen of the character she portrayed, added a brightness, a certain lift to the play, whenever she appeared on the stage.  
Dag Killion, a student at Michigan State, was outstanding in the comedy role of July Confield. She played a giggling girl with a superficial remark for everything, succeeded to the ideal of the stage with an intercurrent of sincerity and a burning desire to do "big things."  
The play dealt with the emotions and struggles of a group of stage-struck girls living in the "Footlight Club," a cheap theatrical boarding house for girls seeking success on Broadway.  
Terry meets Keith Burgess (played by Bruce Mair), a professional playwright who was formerly in love with Terry's "companion," Jean Mathison, played by Nelda Bishop. Jean has met and played up to David Kingley (Helen Durst), a talent scout for motion pictures. Terry and Keith, drawn together, find that they have the same ideal of the stage, as powerful means of delivering a message, and fall in love.  
Terry receives a chance through Jean to go to Hollywood, but she realizes what it would do to her acting and returns to her boarding house for a life of security, with Terry and Keith, drawn along with their ideal, still beautiful.
